





**V. F. W. MARCHERS HOPE FOR NEW BRITAIN PRIZE**

Anderson-Shea Post To Have 100 Members and Kitties Band In Parade There.

Anderson-Shea Post, V. F. W., will be represented 100 strong at the State Convention of the Veterans of Foreign Wars to be held in New Britain, June 24-26 and 28. Delegates and alternates from the local post will attend the three-day session under the leadership of Commander Joseph Moriarty, and the parade to be held Saturday, June 25 at 2:30, is expected to draw fully 100 members from the local post in defense of the title of the "best appearing group" awarded last year at the state convention in Willimantic.

Due to a previous engagement, Dilworth-Cornell Post Five, Drum and Bugle Corps will not accompany the local veteran body to New Britain and the Manchester Pipe Band has been secured to lead the Manchester delegation which will have the position of honor, "right of the line" in the veterans' division.

The Manchester post marchers will be attired in red, white and blue uniforms and with the "kitties" at the head of the column, it is expected that the boys will bring home the prize again this year. The Manchester Pipe Band will be the only such musical organization in the parade which will include over 25 bands from this and other states.

**PRINCE VISITS POPE**

Vatican City, June 15.—(AP)—Prince Boncompagni Ludovisi paid a visit today to Pope Pius XI, the first time a governor of Rome has done so since the Pope became voluntary "prisoner" in the Vatican. The governor's call, which took place at noon, is one of a series of

visits of government officials following the reconciliation between the Vatican and the State and Premier Mussolini's call on the Pope on February 11.

The governor's father Ugo Boncompagni Ludovisi is a monarchist. He entered the priesthood following the death of his wife in 1895. The governor's visit lasted nearly half an hour.

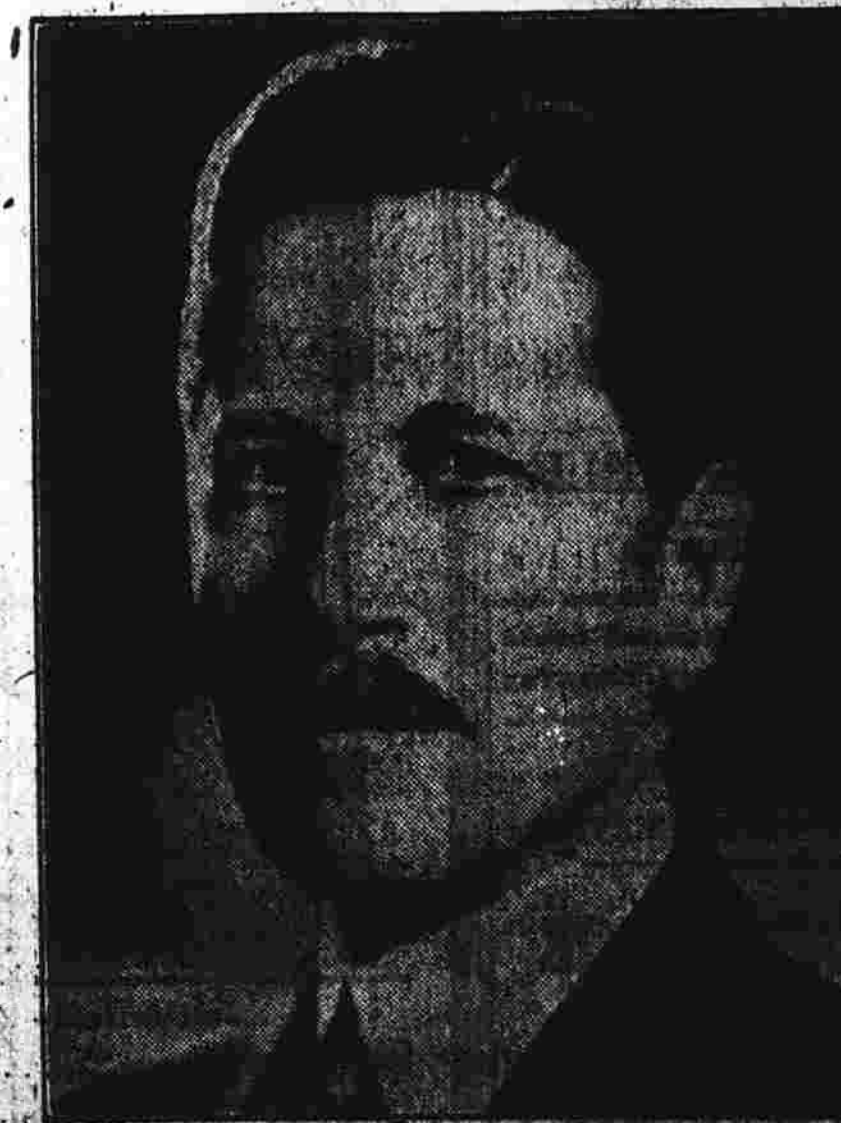
