

PRESIDENT SIGNS BANKRUPTCY BILL

New Measure Helps to Release Many Corporations of Nation Now in Receivers' Hands.

Washington, June 7.—(AP)—At the stroke of noon, President Roosevelt today signed into law a bankruptcy bill to facilitate the release of numerous corporations from the hands of receivers.

The White House made clear that the bill would be signed just when the clock showed twelve so that applicants for its benefits could get off to an even start, with no preference for those in the hands of receivers.

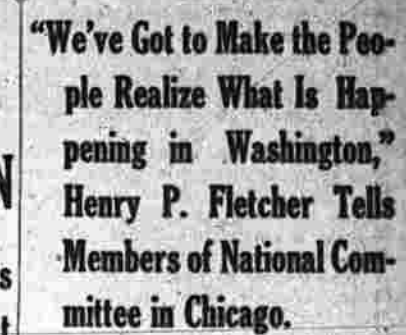
