

21 MONTHS OLD BOY BELIEVED KIDNAPED

Police Say It Looks Like Another Lindbergh Case — 1,000 Searchers Fail to Find Child.

Hartford, N. Y., July 13.—(AP)—Bobby Connor, 21 months old, has been missing 18 hours at noon today and fruitless tramping through Secor woods by 1,000 searchers led to the fear he was in the hands of a kidnaper.

No ransom demands had been received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles H. Connor, or at the home of his wealthy grandfather, Charles P. Connor, Arlington, Mass., and police searched for him in the neighborhood late yesterday.

Possibly the child who is about the age of Charles A. Lindbergh, Jr., when he was kidnaped and killed two years ago, had toddled away and become lost faded this morning.

Dozens of posses had covered miles of ground; a trained police dog had traced an elliptical route a few yards back to the starting point. The dog was given the scent and ended the trail a few minutes later at a street corner a block from the O'Connor home where Ruth Schweigerman, 3, a neighbor's child, said she left Bobby after a walk at 5:30 last night.

The boy had not had his supper and Mrs. O'Connor was fearful when she thought that if he was lost in the woods he would be hungry and frightened.

Sure It's Kidnaping. Captain Philip J. McQuillan was in charge of the search. He took a few hours sleep at 4 a. m. and returned to lead the systematic efforts to cover the countryside on foot at 10 a. m.

All the searching has brought up nothing, said Captain McQuillan. "I am convinced the boy has been kidnaped and I am afraid it was the work of a degenerate. No professional would have considered high ransom."

**GOODWILL FLIGHT ROUND WORLD NEXT**

**Five American Aviators to Start Sunday on Trip Backed by Business Men.**

Chicago, July 15 (AP)—Five American flyers plotted a round-the-world course today for a "goodwill flight" to be started Sunday under the sponsorship of a group of American business men.

The long trail for their solitary ship led chiefly to Moscow, where they planned to spend a week, or two, making "friendly" hops from the Soviet capital.

Going by way of Bermuda, the Azores, Paris and Berlin, they rounded their return across Siberia and Alaska to Chicago.

Lead. Comm. William H. Alexander of New York, former chief instructor at the U. S. Navy training station at Pensacola, Fla., will be in command of the plane.

With him will be co-pilots, Lt. Comm. John Wycliffe Isaman of New York, author of several technical books on aviation, and Major William C. Brooks of Lincoln, Neb., who organized the Niagara air force and was the first man to set a loop record with two consecutive loops and the first altitude record holder.

Radio officer will be Capt. Arthur Fitch of the Merchant Marine. Flight mechanic will be John Fickel. It was possible a sixth man, either Charles Heath of Boston or S. McCallister, both of New York, would accompany them as technical officer.

The plane will go first to New York, arriving about midnight on Monday. It will take off on Tuesday at dawn for Bermuda, and continue Tuesday to the Azores.

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**U. S. NAVY PLANS FOR PACT STRENGTH**

**To Enlist 5,000 More Men and Build 19 New Warships Before '36.**

Washington, July 15 (AP)—Looking toward treaty strength by 1932, the Navy has adopted a plan calling for 5,000 more enlisted men and the laying down of 19 new ships in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1936.

This "operating force" plan would give the Navy \$8,000 more, as compared with \$2,500 during the present year. The new ships would include 12 destroyers of 1,500 tons each, two heavy destroyers and five submarines.

A high Navy official said the building program is being pointed toward a future plan of laying down around 15 ships—regularly each year. This number will take care of obsolete vessels and provide necessary replacements even of battleships. The cost is estimated at around \$100,000,000 a year.

Gradually, this goal is being approached. Thirty-two ships were started last fiscal year and 24 will be laid down this year. The program depends, of course, on what Congress provides. Budgetary estimates of the cost of the 1936 program have not been prepared.

Official figures show that a submarine would cost at least \$5,000,000, a heavy destroyer \$3,775,000 and a light destroyer \$3,400,000. At this rate, the 19 new fighting craft would cost about \$65,000,000.

Compared with the present man-power, which is said to be 81 per cent of complement, an enlisted personnel of 30,000 would raise the strength to a little more than 90 percent.

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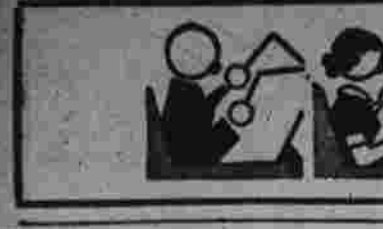
