





New York, July 16.—(AP)—The German government has been warned by J. P. Morgan that "the world will not understand nor soon forget" If it suspends payments on the Dawes and Young plan loan bonds held by American investors. The warning was contained in a cablegram sent by J. P. Morgan and Company to the German Minister of Finance.




