

THREATEN PRIESTS WITH KIDNAPING

New Hanging Decree of Dollfus Collapses When Man Convicted of Bombing Charges Gets Jail Sentence

Vienna, July 23.—(AP)—The expectation of at least a dozen hangings in Austria this week under the new compulsory death penalty decree of Chancellor Engelbert Dollfus collapsed today when a man found guilty of bombing and arson, both crimes carrying the death penalty, was sentenced to eight years' imprisonment.

The man, a 41-year-old Nazi, was found guilty by a court martial of destroying a telephone booth with an incendiary bomb. It had generally been assumed that he would be hanged, since he not only illegally possessed explosives but used them against public communication lines and burned down the booth as well.

May Kidnap Priests.
Nazi in Austria were circulating a secret threat that five priests will be kidnaped and held as hostages for each Nazi who may be condemned to death. If the Nazi dies, says the threat, the priest will die. The Socialists were reported to be preparing similar retaliatory measures in case any of their men are hanged.

Meanwhile the secretly circulated Socialist organ "Arbeiter Zeitung" commented: "The hatred against the government is so intense that 'treason' with gallows no longer have any effect.

To Try Bombers.
The Socialist bombers and another Socialist who supplied them with explosives for dynamiting a railroad track are scheduled for court martial this week. The two bombers shot and critically wounded a policeman in their attempted escape.

Court martials are also scheduled for five Nazis arrested in various sections of Austria for the possession of explosives. Other similar arrests are expected momentarily.

**REPORT 14 DEAD
OVER THE WEEK-END**

**But Two Auto Fatalities in
State; Five Suicides and
Two Drowned.**

(By Associated Press)
Death invaded Connecticut over the week-end and after traveling a record-breaking drought spell, claimed 14 lives—one of its most violent demands of the year in the state.

Attacking from the highways, water, electricity and other sources, death matched its victims from various sectors of the state.

Four fatalities of one which is problematical, resulted from suicides—two died from a highway crash, two met death from drowning, while one body which had been in the water for several days was recovered.

Meanwhile the state, in the midst of a record-breaking drought spell, gained a brief respite Sunday when the mercury diminished its scorching grip. Also some hope could be found in the prediction of cooler weather for today.

For farmers another day without rain meant further destruction to their parched crops. Yesterday was the 14th day in which the state has failed to receive any measurable amount of rainfall and the weather men said it might extend even to the 20th day.

An oddity of the week and which was usually inviting for means of escaping the heat, was the scarcity of violence through the highway and waterways. Only four of the fourteen deaths taking these paths.

Two On Saturday

Hoover did not go into detail about the women. First reports had it that Dillinger went to the theatre and emerged alone to face the combat of 15 justice agents armed with pistols.

Chicago, July 23.—(AP)—He staggered from a neighborhood theater last night into the raking fire of government guns. Too late he saw the glancing steel of the trap set for him.

His hand went for his gun. Too late. Three bullets tore into his body—one in the head, two in the body. He staggered, fell.

The hour was 10:40 p. m. central daylight saving time. The place was just outside the Biograph theater, a neighborhood movie at Lincoln and Lincoln avenues, on the northwest side, in territory where the blood of many a Chicago gangster has flowed before.

The coup which brought about Dillinger's end was executed with a flash. Commendation poured in even during the post-midnight hours.

"Gratifying as well as reassuring," Attorney General Cummings declared at Washington.

Department of Justice agents had known for several days that Dillinger was on the North Side, Purvis learned he planned to attend a movie at the Biograph. He selected 15 minutes for a grim coincidence of time for each victim of numbers attributed to the Dillinger maudliners.

Captain Tim O'Neil of the East Chicago, Ind., police department who participated in a gun battle against Dillinger and John Hamilton during an attempted bank robbery there last January, also fought four of his men to the show house.

The slaying of Sergeant William O'Malley in that East Chicago skirmish furnished the only murder charge against Dillinger. Two Chicago detectives swelled the force.

The Federal were assigned to attention, and assumed the nonchalant air of so many riders.

Purvis gave this official version: "I made arrangements to surround the theater with picked men from among my investigators. They were armed only with pistols. No shot for I wished no general firing that might endanger passersby. I stationed myself in my automobile parked two doors south of the theater. My men were stationed in doorways. 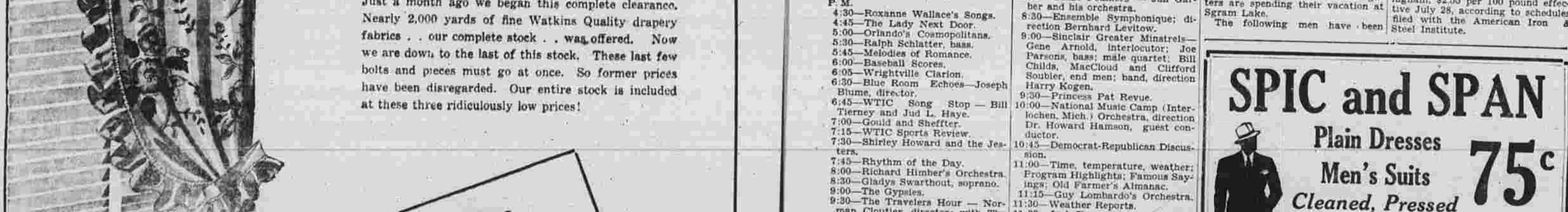

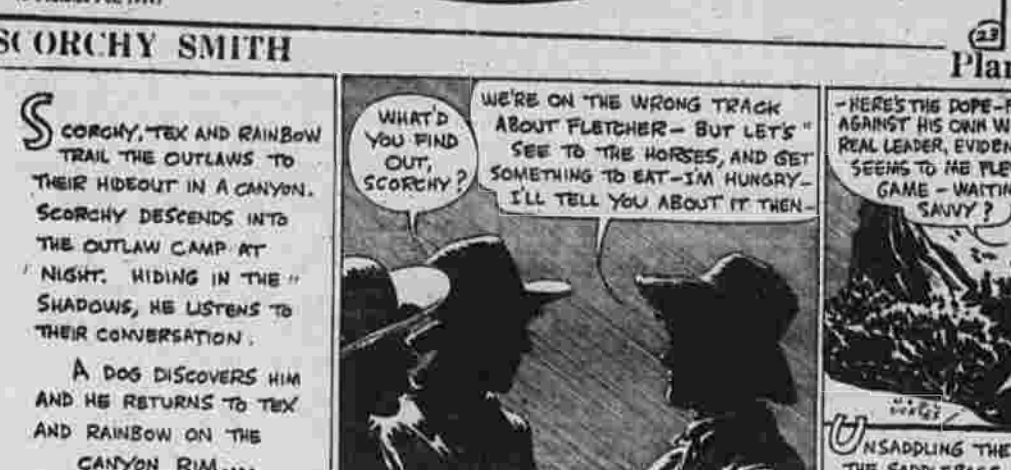
