

AUSTRIAN CHANCELLOR KILLED

CROWDS FILE PAST DILLINGER CASKET

Steady Stream of Curious Look Upon Features of Outlaw—Funeral Service in Sister's Home Tomorrow Afternoon.

Maywood, Ind., July 25.—(AP)—Wooden casket John Dillinger lay in death today in the home of the sister who reared him as an obscure country boy before he "made his name" as the nation's most hunted criminal.

A steady stream of the curious passed last night by the casket in which the outlaw's body, its bullet marks obliterated by plastic surgery, awaited burial.

A few hours earlier, citizens of the Mooreville vicinity, many of whom knew "Johnny" as a boy before he was sent to prison ten years ago, had filed past his body at Mooreville undertaking establishment.

Dad brings back body John Dillinger, Sr., elderly and respected farmer, brought his notorious son's body back home yesterday from Chicago, where the outlaw's career was ended by bullets of Federal agents Sunday night.

Thousands of curiosity seekers from Indianapolis, 18 miles away, came to state and city police struggled to keep the line of automobiles moving. Many parked their cars and walked miles to see the corpse.

A plastic surgeon worked on the body to erase the bullet marks. Another surgeon's knife had given Dillinger new features in life to help him evade capture.

After a family conference last night, the father sent to newspapers an announcement the funeral would be tomorrow at the home here of Mrs. Audrey Hancock, John's sister.

Awaiting the body is a grave in Crown Hill cemetery at Indianapolis next to that of Dillinger's mother and not far from where many of Indiana's notables in letters and politics have found a last resting place.

Also buried there are President Benjamin Harrison, Vice President Thomas Marshall, James Whitcomb Riley, the Hoosier poet, Ken Hurlburt, author of Abe Martin and others.

MACHINE GUNS OPEN UP FIRE IN CAPITAL

Engelbert Dollfuss Captured and Wounded in "Putsch" to Take Over Government of Austria—President Miklas Reported to Be in Custody of Revolving Faction—Prince Ernst Von Starhemberg Escapes from the Nazis and Forms His Own Counter Action.

London, July 25.—(AP)—An Exchange Telegraph Agency Dispatch from Prague today said it was officially announced at 7:15 p. m. that the Austrian Legation that Chancellor Dollfuss of Austria was dead.

The same agency said the Austrian Legation also announced that the control of the building had been taken over by Dr. Kurt Schuschnigg, minister of justice and education in the Dollfuss Cabinet.

It is known definitely that Engelbert Dollfuss was held as a prisoner on the balcony of the building to speak to the officers outside. Following one of these appearances, the regular troops which had drawn up before the building, marched away.

Dr. Schuschnigg gave the express command for them to withdraw. His action was interpreted as perhaps being a part of the negotiations—ordered by the Nazis—to release the prisoners.
