REV. W. J. JUDGE NAMED PASTOR AT ST. BRIDGET'S

Waterbury Priest Appointed to Church Here—Assistant Also Named—Rev. Kenney Goes to Danbury.

The Rev. William J. Judge for the past six years rector of St. Thomas's church in Waterbury was today named to the pastorate of St. Bridget's church here which was made vacant by the death of the Rev. Christopher T. McCann on February 14. The Rev. John F. Kenney, who has been acting pastor of St. Bridget's church since the death of Father McCann has been named assistant at St. Joseph's church, Danbury.

For the first time since St. James's parish was organized here an assistant has been named to St. Bridget's church. The Rev. Leo J. Pechie will be assistant to Rev. Judge in the work of the parish. Pechie is a recently ordained priest and this is his first assignment. When St. Bridget's was the only parish in town an assistant was regularly appointed there. The appointments were announced through the Catholic Transcript today by Bishop McAuliffe.

Rev. William J. Judge is a native of Hartford. He was born in that city on September 3, 1872. He studied at St. Peter's school and graduated from Hartford Public High school. He matriculated at Niagara University, Niagara, N. Y., where he completed his academic studies. He studied theology at St. John's Seminary, Brighton, Mass., and was ordained at St. Joseph's Cathedral, Hartford, on December 22, 1900.

His first appointment after ordination was as assistant at St. Joseph's, Meriden. On July 27, 1910 he was transferred to St. Patrick's, Waterbury. His first assignment as a pastor was to St. John's, Middletown, on March 1, 1914. After three years in Middletown he was made rector of St. John's, Waterbury and
