LOSS OF PEACH CROP HITS TOWN

Sale of Baskets Alone Is Big Item to One Local Concern.

With the arrival of the usual peach canning season there are no local peaches to can. It's hard to believe but it's true and this is all

due to a week of sub-zero weather last winter that destroyed the trees. One enterprising fruit and produce dealer in town has arranged for enough Georgia peaches to supply his usual demand to make up for the loss of his orchard. Peaches now being sold in retail stores are all coming from the South.

There are other aspects to the situation that probably few people realize. Several business houses here sold a total of more than 150,000 peach baskets a season in normal times. This business will be wiped out for the next five or six years until new trees begin bearing again. Practically the only outlet for baskets remaining will be for tomatoes and apples.

Peach growers are starting new orchards everywhere and in Bolton

and other sections where there are a large number of Italian farmers and peach growers they are turning to market garden produce such as tomatoes, peppers, cauliflower, etc.
