DOLLFUSS SLAYERS HANGED IN VIENNA

Otto Planetta and Franz Holzweber, convicted of High Treason, Executed Within Three Hours of Receiving Death Sentence.

Vienna, July 31.—(AP)—Two Nazis accused of killing Chancellor Engelbert Dollfuss were hanged this afternoon after they had been convicted by a court martial of high treason.

The two men—Otto Planetta, former soldier, and Franz Holzweber, were hanged after a plea of their counsel for clemency was rejected.

Planetta was accused of firing the fatal shots and Holzweber of leading the Nazi mob into the Federal Chancellery last Wednesday.

Planetta said in the course of the trial that he fired the fatal shot, adding: "I did not mean to kill the Chancellor. I am sorry."

Holzweber was charged with leading the Nazi mob in which the Chancellor was slain.

Oddly enough, the death sentences passed today are the first made by an Austrian court against Nazis despite the fact that Dollfuss' death sentence was pronounced against persons found guilty of sedition activities. Several socialists were executed under these decrees but the death sentence was never passed against a Nazi while Dollfuss was alive.
