Hartford, Aug. 8.—(AP)—The Connecticut State Banking department has refused to do "police duty" for federal authorities who have sought information concerning banks connected with state banks which would enable the federal authorities to check on possible violations of Federal regulations, Commissioner Perry said.

The state banking department, he says, is willing to co-operate to the extent of its power as an authority in the interest of sound banking. It is not, however, authorized specifically to furnish the giving out of any information disclosed by state examinations except in line of duty.

PITTSBURGH FLOOD DAMAGES PROPERTY

Temperature Drops from 90 to 60 After Heavy Down-pour, Motorists Marooned

Pittsburgh, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Streets and homes in the lowlands of Pittsburgh were flooded today and many motorists were marooned by a storm which drenched most of western Pennsylvania with the heaviest rain of the season.

Temperatures which were nearly 90 degrees in many districts dropped 20 points and more.

Residents rushed to safety in the Panther Hollow section of Pittsburgh with their flood-creeping cars. Some homes floated away in large sections of a hillside near the Fair. Seventeen street incinerators, causing a landslide which crashed down upon a switch engine and a street car, were destroyed.

The storm broke about 2 a. m. and the water activity of the Allegheny river was so high that it was feared that it would reach the city. It was estimated that 3 to 4 inches of rain fell over the city.

HITLER RELEASES POLITICAL FOES SENDS PRICES UP

Grants Amnesty to Thousands of Prisoners in Jails and Prison Camps.

Berlin, Aug. 8.—(AP)—In his first official act as both President and Chancellor, Adolf Hitler today granted unexpected freedom to thousands of political prisoners incarcerated in German jails and concentration camps.

Liberation of the political prisoners was proclaimed in an official statement which will occur in October. It is the first step toward a "general amnesty law" and "amnesty for political prisoners."

The liberation order will apply generally only to those convicted of minor political offenses. In no cases will sentences for high treason, military espionage and attempts against the life of the Kaiser be commuted.

PRESIDENT'S ORDER NATIONALIZATION OF SILVER SENDS PRICES UP

The silver bill was passed by a vote of 233 to 127 in the House of Representatives. It provides for the purchase of 350,000,000 ounces of silver bullion over a period of 10 years.
