Washington, Aug. 9.—(AP)—
President Roosevelt today Issued an executive order providing for the nationalization of silver at 50.01 cents per ounce according to the provisions of the Silver Purchase Act of 1934.

The President's proclamation, made public by Secretary Morgenthau are doing is calling into the Treasury stocks of bullion silver which are traded in on the commercial markets. These stocks may range anywhere from 45,000,000 to 250,000,000 ounces.

Buying in this silver at the rate of 50.01 cents an ounce is what is preant by "Nationalizing" silver. It is taking government ownership of foating commercial stocks not being used in industry and commerce.


