TEXTILE STRIKE PLANS ARE LAID
Leaders Pleased at Assurance That Workers Will Be Fed by ERA.

Washington, Aug. 20.—(AP)—The strike committee set up by the United Textile Workers of America to call a general strike in the cotton textile industry on or before September 1, revealed today that the industry would be closed for at least 30 days and asserted the next move would come from the industry or the administration.

Francis J. Gorman, vice president of the union and chairman of the strike committee, said labor planned to make the workers either to the industry of administrative agencies but was to which it might be invited.
