## IL DUCE IS PLANNING NEW AUSTRIAN PACT

Report That Military Clause  
Is Being Drafted for a  
Triple Alliance—Officials  
in Conference.

Florence, Italy, Aug. 21.—(AP)—Unconfirmed rumors said today that Premier Mussolini of Italy and Chancellor Schuschnigg of Austria, meeting here, were drafting a military clause for the Italo-Austro-Hungarian accord.

The clause would be one of mutual assistance between the three countries and would permit Italy to march into Austria if necessary to aid that nation. Well-informed sources, however, said they were not inclined to give the rumor much credence.

Certain it was, however, that Mussolini and Schuschnigg conferred together this morning. The Italian under-secretary of state, after Schuschnigg's arrival by train from Austria this morning.

They talked in the magnificent old Villa de Marina, set deep in a park of trees overlooking the city. Both premiers emerged from their meeting looking apparently satisfied with the long talk but without giving any indication of the subject of their conversation.

From their conference room they went into a rich but restricted luncheon attended by fourteen other dignitaries, including Buvick and Achille Starace, the general secretary of the Fascist Party.

War Maneuvers

Because Florence is the center of military maneuvers, the city is under strict wartime measures and the heads of the neighboring governments, entered it under conditions of unharmed early today. ## HITLER ATTACKS GERMANY'S REDS

Blames Communists for Casting  
Four Million Votes  
Against Him at Election.

Berlin, Aug. 21.—(AP)—New Nazi highlanders against communists was anticipated today because of their suspected heavy participation in the rolling up of more than 4,000,000 votes against Chancellor Hitler in Sunday's plebiscite.

Although there has been a conspiracy to ward Communist as a result of a recent amnesty law for political prisoners, the German press assumed sharp attacks on the party.

Called Black Sheep

How Hitler, his assumption of the powers of the late President Paul von Hindenburg, approved by an overwhelming majority of Germans, plans to bring the more than 4,000,000 "black sheep" into the Nazi fold, became a topic of lively discussion.

The four million are men and women in all parts of the Reich.

That Hitler already has a plan of action, was indicated in a post-plebiscite declaration in which he said "my task and the task of all of us, will be to consolidate this unity and to win over all the rest of our people to our ideals and doctrine and inspired incessant and determined efforts."

## Discover New Vaccine To Prevent Pneumonia

Philadelphia, Aug. 21.—(AP)—A study and research in the institute of contagious medicine of Philadelphia, which he directs in addition to holding the title of university professor, Dr. Joseph Goldberger, announced today that he had discovered a vaccine to prevent pneumonia.

## PALESTINE JEWS SCORED BY RABBI IN ADDRESS

New York Clergyman Criticizes Them for Not Joining in the World Boycott Against Germany.

Geneva, Aug. 21.—(AP)—Rabbi Stephen S. Wise declared today that he refused to be intimidated in his stand on the relationship between German Nazis and world Jewry.

He revealed that efforts had been made to induce him to refrain from a speech before the World Jewish Conference scheduled for tonight, but that he had refused to join in the world boycott against Germany.

Rabbi Wise made it clear he was determined to adhere to the program of the conference, declaring "that trafficking of Jewish Palestine with Nazi Germany must cease at once." He said Jews can but admire the courageous way in which the Protestant and Catholic clergy in Germany have criticized Hitler's religious policy.

Hitful Picture

Jacob Getchinsky, edited German economist and newspaperman, in an address before the conference, painted a doleful picture of the economic position of the Jewish people.

He declared that in 1933, 60,000 Jews had left Germany, and in the first six months of this year, 10,000 more had gone.

The position of the Jews who are remaining is bleak," he said, "becoming desperate since there is no hope of finding shelter abroad."

He described conditions abroad as worse than desperate due to the depression, economic conditions of countries which absorbed a large proportion of the Jewish refugees. He explained that Jews in Poland, Rumania, Lithuania and Latvia were refused employment in state undertakings.

## KIDNAPING STORY IS NOT BELIEVED

Federal Agents Refuse to Take Seriously Statements Made by Evangelist.

Goldboro, N. C., Aug. 21.—(AP)—Obviously incredulous of his bizarre story of being kidnaped by three men and released in Tennessee, Department of Justice agents today prepared to cross-examine Dr. Jesse James, a member of "Four Square" evangelist, as soon as his condition permits.

The young evangelist returned to his wife and flock here yesterday, but immediately upon his arrival he was ordered to be taken to the hospital. Several of his associates would not permit him to see visitors for several days.

Jesse James, a member of Aske's congregation who drove him to the hospital, said a slight breeze would blow the man's story away.

Notes Received

After a week between here and Smithfield last Tuesday, typewritten notes were received by the editors of the Herald. The notes and a similar note was sent to the editor of the State newspaper, threatening to dynamite Asheville, if the money was not paid.

Aske's 30-year-old wife and many members of his congregation here expressed the conviction that the evangelist was abducted by enemies made during a religious controversy here which Speaker Aske's resigning the pastorate of the Free Will Baptist church to start "Four Square" meetings in a tent.

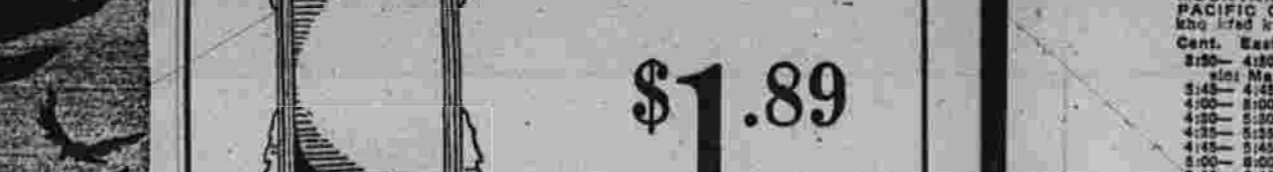

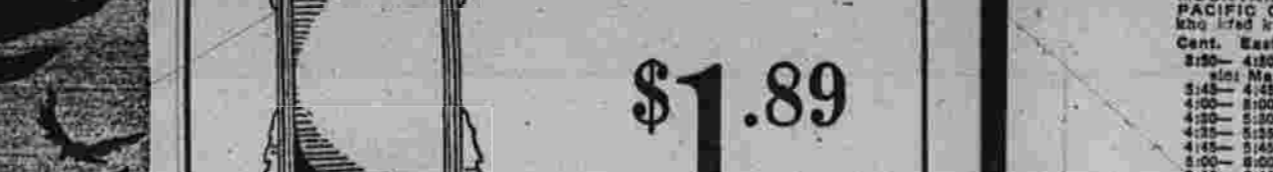
