

STRIKE SITUATION IS UNCHANGING

MOVES TO FORCE SHUTDOWNS FAIL IN NEW ENGLAND

Secretary Perkins, of Labor Department, Expresses Confidence That President's Board Can Settle Controversy.

BULLETIN:
Washington, Sept. 7.—(AP)—Both Francis J. Gorman, chairman of the textile strike committee, and George A. Sloan, president of the Cotton Textile Institute, agreed today to meet President Roosevelt's new textile strike board within the next six hours.

Militant efforts of strike leaders to force shutdowns in the textile industry focused in New England today and met with scant success as the number of estimated idle workers increased 10,000 to almost 170,000.

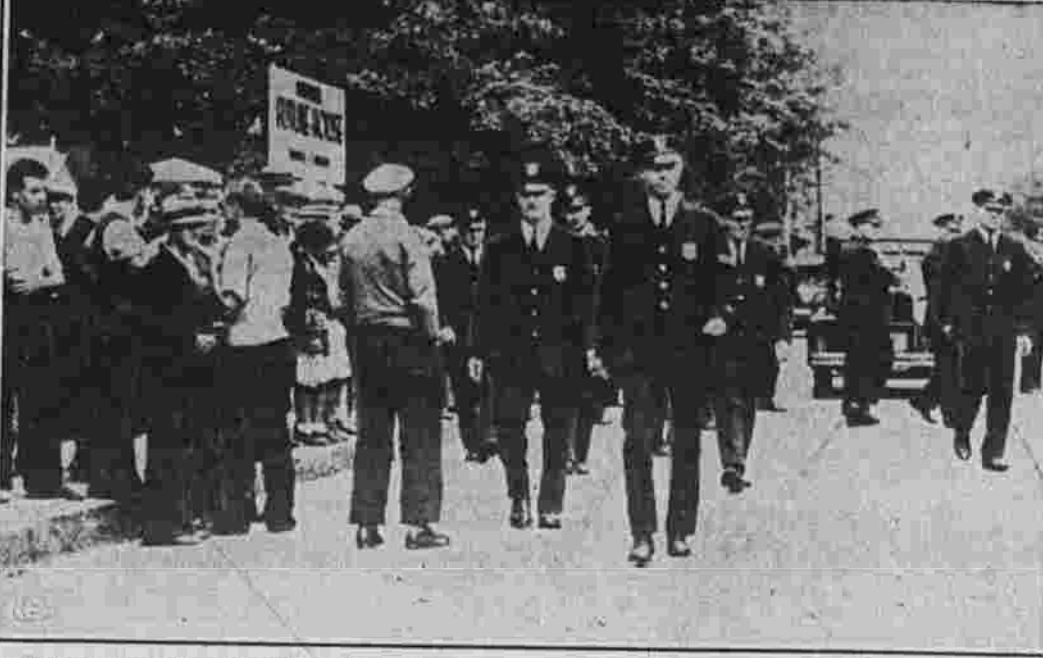
Peter van Horn, leader of the silk manufacturers, said in New York City that if protection could be obtained for the industry all possibility of the success of the strike would be removed by Monday.

Francis J. Gorman, chairman of the union strike committee in Washington, declared that the strike was already "85 per cent effective" and denied that a general strike of all labor unions was imminent.

LEAGUE PLANS TO GUARD FRENCH, SOVIET ENVOYS

Geneva Hears Rumors That Fascists Are Preparing a Demonstration When the Council Holds Its Sessions.

Local authorities were advised by the central government at Bern of rumors that manifestations were being prepared by Fascist elements against both the French and Russian representatives.
