The annual primaries of the Republican and Democratic parties opened at 10 o'clock this morning with an unusually large number of people in attendance and in line, registering the heaviest first hour's voting in years. The unprecedented rush for the polls today at the opening hour was due, in a large measure, to the closing of the outdoor mass meeting of local 2125, U. T. W. in Center Park, which was held at a half hour before the polls opened. Many of those who listened to the speakers in the park remained to vote before getting to their homes.

The polls close tonight at 9 o'clock, daylight time.

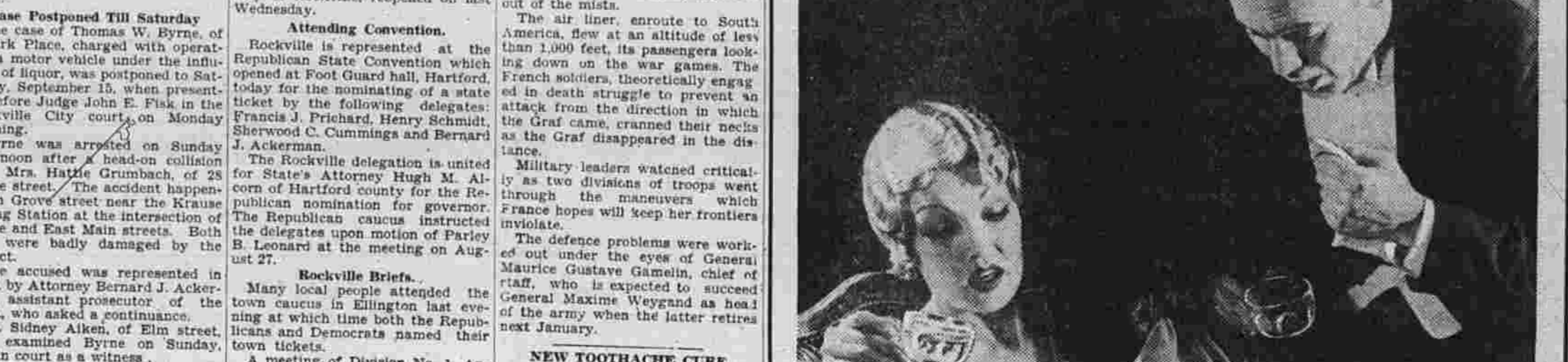
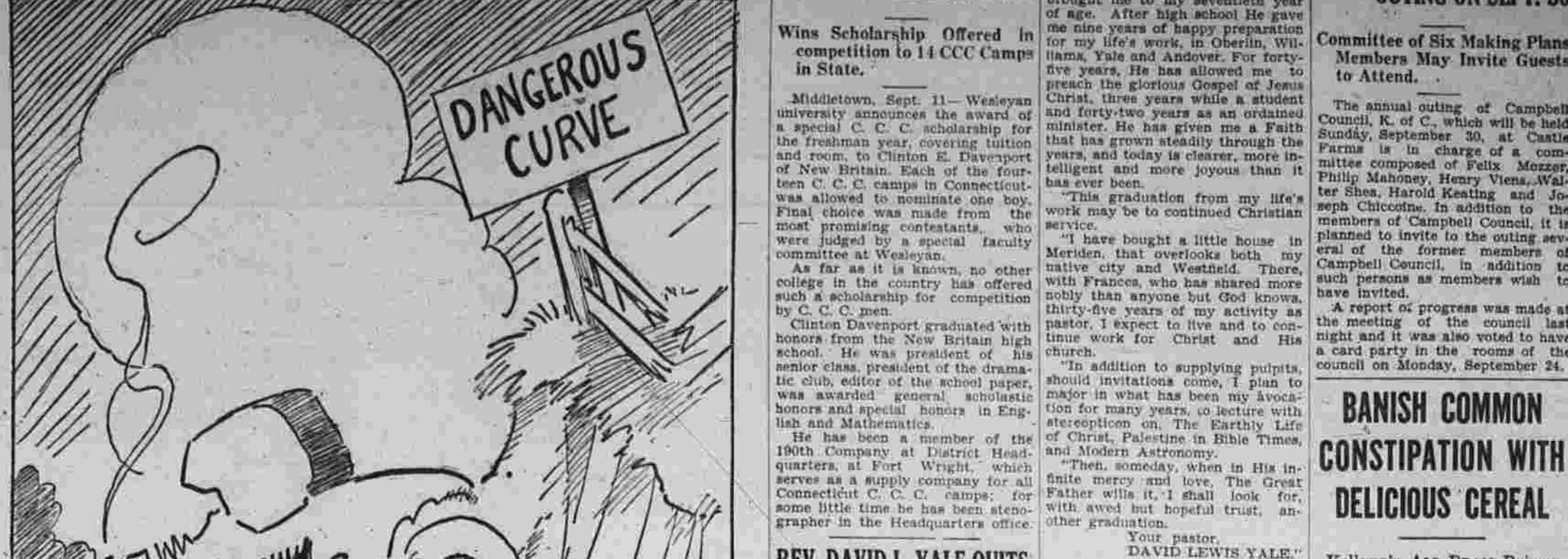

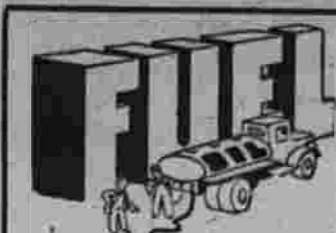
