THREE MORE UNITS OF STATE MILITIA MOVE TO PUTNAM

Additional Companies Will Make Five on Scene of Rioting, Strikers Are Reported as Being Armed.

Putnam, Sept. 12.—(AP)—Conditions outside the holding plant were unchanged this afternoon but tensions seemed to prevail on the streets, both among strikers who were trying to picket at a distance, and the soldiers who were on patrol.

Occasionally overhead there was an aviation section plane which circled about. Officers who recognized the craft said it was apparently equipped for service by carrying tear bombs.

Another report without confirmation was that an airplane had been seen here from Rhode Island.

Putnam, Sept. 12.—(AP)—Company E was reported on the way here and Companies I, New Britain and A. Meriden, were being mobilized for active duty.

Guard officers revealed at noon today that the companies will arrive at the holding-Hemlock - Corticelli plant here where approximately 700 strikers, sympathizers and observers are massed about the factory property.

This will make a total of three companies leaving here this afternoon and five tonight when the other two arrive. They are only to be called down here, however, if the situation becomes severe enough to warrant it, the guard officers stated.

Truck Is Stopped A truck leaving the plant was stopped and a search made of the plant windows presumably by strikers, nearly struck a woman employee.

Officers declared that strikers were armed with stones, brickbats, section of iron pipes, and few revolvers.

At the request of the plant management plans were being laid to move the troops closer to the factory. It now requires approximately 10 minutes for them to get there in an emergency. It is hoped to move them into the idle plant of the Adams Manufacturing Co., which

is located on the west side of the city. Mr. Shortz announced at the meeting today that a bakery on Broad street had offered to donate every night at 7 o'clock. The bakers of Manchester also have offered to repair the shoes of strikers' families while the strike lasts.

John Gardner, 35, of 84 Maple street, was arrested by the state police in Lyette yesterday after he was alleged to have hurled a stone at an automobile in the yard of the Boston Velvet company. State Police Officer John Smith said that Gardner was in the picket line and that he had received head wounds. President Shortz said the union posted bonds of \$50 and that Gardner was at the meeting here today.

Secretary John G. Egan of the Connecticut Federation of Labor addressed the strikers today. Mr. Egan said he was to confer with Governor Wilbur L. Cross this morning in an effort to induce the governor to order the withdrawal of the militia at Danbury and Putnam.

ROGERS, THORNTON WIN OVER BOWERS

Renominated as Candidates for Representative in Republican Primary; Hohenthal Wins Easily in Assessorship Race.

Thomas J. Rogers and William J. Thornton, both candidates for reelection in the General Assembly, were renominated yesterday in the Republican primary. Rogers, secretary of the Board of Selectmen, was backed by Local 2125 U. T. W. Thornton won over Bowers by 41 votes and the issue was not decided until the vote of the last machine was registered.

The primary brought out a record vote of the Republican party, the machine registering a grand total of 4,030 Democratic and Republican ballots, an increase over the 3,600 record vote of 629 votes.

The Selectmen nominated in the order of the highest votes were: Aaron Cook, David Chambers, Joseph Perry, Sherwood Bowers, James H. Johnston, Frank V. Williams and John Jensen. Cook, Chambers, Bowers and Williams were seeking reelection to the board and Perry, Johnston and Jensen are new members. Perry yesterday made his third bid for membership on the Board of Selectmen and his strong support, placing third in order of majority, was the result of a determined effort on the part of his friends and supporters to rally to his support.

Aaron Cook, member of the Board of Selectmen for the past two years and a strong vote getter, led the list of aspirants.

The four-cornered race for nomination of Assessor, expected to be close, proved to be a landslide for candidate L. G. Hohenthal, the latter a candidate for the Board of Assessors for the three year term, recorded 1,227 votes against 694 given Clarence H. Adams, his nearest rival for the office. Louis L. Grant of Buckland placed third and four respectively.

MORE WAVES IN SEA THAN UPON SURFACE

Science Expects Its New "Rat Trap" to Give the Real Answer.

are not small like surface waves but made like tidal waves. Their surface is not more than 100 feet down. It lies under the "homogeneous" layer of top sea water, a layer created by the churning of wind and waves, and of difference in temperature, density and salinity.

The "homogeneous" layer is a sort of featureless, Neptune's blanket covering the calm deep. It has been beneath it only rarely. With a "blowing" sea it may almost disappear. Swimmers ordinarily swim in this blanket, but occasionally it gets so thin their bodies reach into the colder water below.

NEW TAX CRISIS STIRS IRELAND

De Valera's Foes Find Hope in Irish Taxation Middle.

By MILTON BRUNNER NKA Service Staff Correspondent London, Sept. 11.—"Up de Valera!"

That was the battle cry in the Irish Free State elections for the Dail in February, 1932, and the friends of de Valera, in combination with various other elements, obtained a majority. President W. T. Cosgrave was supplanted after ten years' rule.

President Eamon de Valera converted to undo many of the things Cosgrave had done. He repealed the public safety act, and released a lot of political prisoners. He withheld the payment to Great Britain of \$7,500,000 in annual land purchase annuities.

Replying to criticisms, President de Valera dissolved the Dail and called for a new election. The voters gave his party a clear majority and he has steadily pressed forward his program of making the Free State a self-contained nation.

On the debit side, the Free State still remained one of Britain's best customers, while selling steadily less. The adverse balance of trade has increased. The great landlords and big farmers have protested that, if it is going to pay Great Britain land annuities, it is equally wrong to pay them into the Irish treasury.

But the worst blow came from the famous Guinness Brewery in Dublin. It announces it will open a branch plant at Park Royal, London, to take care of the English trade.

It is estimated the Guinness plant pays about \$1,250,000 tax per year. Opening the plant in England will hurt Ireland in other ways than the loss in taxes. The English branch will buy English barley instead of Irish and the number of employees in Dublin will be cut down.

The latest development is being used by President de Valera's opponents, as an example of what is going to happen if he continues in power. The Irish have gotten so many fighting each other that they have almost entirely forgotten the English. Ultimately there may be a new election in the Dail.

"Up de Valera" once more will be the battle-cry of his followers. "Down with de Valera" will be the counter-cry.

But Eamon still is the most effective stump speaker in the land. He would easily translate the campaign into one of the poor against the rich. And the poor are apt to win. Cheap food for the tenant dwellers in the cities and subsidies for the farmers of tiny patches in the country have "let de Valera heavily."

"The fountain is not for sale!" The employees were right. The fountain is a cast iron relic of 50 years ago, considered lacking in both artistic and intrinsic value, but dilapidated and dry.

St. Jess Johnson, owner of the property on which it stands, says that inquiries as to whether it may be purchased average one every four days the year around.

The fountain has for its center the figures of a 3-year-old boy and girl beneath an umbrella.
