

## NEW CLUES CLASH IN KAMINSKI HUNT

**Break in Rockville Home Early Today Leads Police to Hunt for Early Fugitive Hickey as County Detective Prints in East Hartford Burglary Were Those of Fugitive Guard Slayer.**

Developments today in the Kaminski manhunt which has centered here hither rather than aided the small army of police engaged in tracing the fugitive guard slayer through the various escapades in this vicinity attributed to him.
