






Tinnitus aurium, or ear noises, are described by some as ringing, buzzing or whirring. These annoyances may occur in one ear or both form a short time or at all times. The continual noise in the ear is very annoying and causes the patient much anxiety.

As a general rule, if the noise comes and goes it disappears in the morning when the nerves are rested and returns in the evening when the nerves are fatigued.

Roaring in the ears may be present from a number of causes. Sometimes it is due to a pressure on the drum of the ear from ear wax that has formed a plug. It is frequently noticed in cases of migraine, anemia and neurasthenia. When the patient is anemic, having him take a reclining position will reduce the roise.

An inflammation of the ear will







QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS (Body Odor) Question: Miss Adele B. writes I am a young girl twenty years of age and have been bothered with body odor for about a year and a half. I have used different powders and bath salts but none of them and bath salts but none of them seem to do much good. Would you please tell me, if possible, some cure for this embarrassing situation.

Answer: Your trouble is probably raused by a deep-seated toximia. In such cases the toxic elements are thrown out through the skin and bacteria often enter through the prores, producing an odorous perspiration. Even though the perspiration evaporates and is not noticed, the odor remains. A fasting and dieting regimen such as outlined in my Cleansing Diet Course would prove beneficial. I would also suggest that you take hot Epsom Salts baths, in which a pound of Epsom Salts and one-quarter pound of baking soda should be dissolved, about three times a week, followed by cold showers. Sun baths would also be very helpful. 




