

Many thousands of people are constipated without knowing it, for the reason that although a regular elimination occurs each day, the contents are so delayed that the material thrown out should have been gotten rid of two or three days before. As a matter of fact, I regard the patient who has only one movement daily as constipated and with normal health, at least two, and preferably three move-

If you wish to use a simple home test to find out if the food material is moving along the intestine as fast as it should, all you have to do is to take a large helping of cooked beets. The red coloring of the beets will appear in the feces within eighteen hours if the body cleanses itself well; will appear in twenty-four hours if the action is irregularity of habit. The patient grows careless about attending to this important matter at a definite, regular time.

Over-eating of the wrong kind of food must be avoided in overcoming constipation. Eating more than you need taxes the digestion and produces enervation. Temporary stuffing on vegetables may be helpful, as suggested in my article on Stuffing for Constipation, but this is the only kind of over eating permissable.

Reservoir by the Bridgeport Hydraulic Company, the largest reservoir in Connecticut until the completion of Lake Gaillard, raised the storage facilities of Bridgeport and environs by 4.3 billions of gallons. The Ansonia Water Company by its new Fountain Lake and enlargement of its Peat Swamp Reservoir boosted its capacity considerably, while the Torrington Water Company increased its storage by 740 million gallons through the Reuben Hart, Hart Brook District and Allen Dam District Reservoirs. South Manchester added 116 million gallons capacity with the Roaring Brook Reservoir. The Northern Connecticut Power Company enlarged the original capacity of its Thompsonville plant and raised that of its Windows Locks plant to four times its original figure.

Among the municipally operated water utilities, Norwich expanded storage facilities by 436 million gallons with the addition of the Deer River Reservoir. Norwalk's First Taxing District contarged the capacity of Lake Kononmoc in Waterford and Montville and the addition of a service reservoir.
