

### G. O. P. GAIN IN RECORD VOTE AT ELECTION

#### Democrats Make Unusual Drive But Slip Back from Year Ago — Chambers Gets Big Vote.

In a record-breaking town election yesterday named all their nominees to town offices and showed a gain in the majority given its candidates despite an unusually strong attack by the Democratic leaders. For the first time since the adoption of the present primary system a larger vote was cast at the town election than was recorded in the Republican primary of the same year. Yesterday's election brought 4,176 voters to the polls, slightly over two thirds of them being Republican voters.

He called on the National Association of Manufacturers which proposed a strike during which no attempt would be made to change existing industrial conditions, first to announce their willingness to comply with the rulings of the arbitrators of the constituted authorities as the President suggested.

Mitchell, former assistant chief of military aviation and a storm center in Army circles since he began his efforts for a unified air service in the 1920s, said that the dirigible was "a great implement in time of war."
