



Engineer Bowen to Submit Proposal to Selectmen at Their Next Meeting.

Plans for a new concrete bridge over the Hop Brook on Olcutt street northeast of the Bunce school are being prepared by Town Engineer J. Frank Bowen and will be completed in time for submission to the next meeting of the 1rd of Selectmen on October 16.

The bridge at present spanning the stream is of wooden construction and approximately 16 feet wide. It is too narrow to permit the passage of a truck and a pleasure car at one time. The guard rails are weak and about the only reinforcement for the floor are three thicknesses of wooden plankings and four iron girders.
