Fixed Charges

Over 50 per cent of this year's budget is made up of fixed charges which cannot be changed. The item for schools constitutes over 50 per cent of the remainder of our budget. With the reductions which have been made in this item since 1951, amounting to 32 per cent, it does not seem advisable to attempt further reductions. After taking out the fixed charges and the school item which constitute \$872,000. of the total there is some 12 per cent to 15 per cent remaining from which reductions can be made. It will thus be seen that no appreciable amount can be taken from the budget as recommended by the Board of Selectmen.






