HAUPTMANN KNEW ROADS IN JERSEY

Maps Showing Highways
Near Lindy Home Found
in His Trunk — Drew
Them from Memory.

New York, Oct. 4.—(AP)—Maps of the Sourland mountain section of New Jersey where the Lindbergh baby was kidnapped and slain and of the Massachusetts region where Col. Lindbergh was directed on a futile trip to recover his son have been found among Bruno Richard Hauptmann's possessions. District Attorney Samuel J. Foley announced today.

They were found in a small trunk in Hauptmann's apartment and Foley said that during questioning Hauptmann displayed "remarkable accuracy" in reproducing the maps from memory, "even down to drawing intersecting forks in New Jersey and Massachusetts territory."

Also in the trunk, Foley said, investigators found nine German-American dictionaries, each of 1,000 words, which contained the more difficult words used in the ransom notes in the kidnap case.

"This, to some extent," Foley said, "confirms the theory that Hauptmann mis-spelled a number of the smaller words, while the more difficult words were written correctly, an indication that he looked up the spelling of the harder words in the dictionary."

The prosecution declined to say whether any of the words in the ransom notes had been marked in the dictionaries, or whether any words in the New Jersey and Massachusetts maps, particularly the sections which figured in the kidnap hunt, had been marked.

New Jersey angle
Foley predicted announcements of the discovery of the maps and dictionaries would not, as he was about to disclose "something with a Jersey angle to it." He said he could not offer any explanation at the present time, but "that may come later."

However, the principal significance of the disclosure regarding the maps was assumed to be its upsetting of Hauptmann's repeated denials that he ever had been in or near Hopewell, N. J., where the Lindbergh baby is located, or that he was familiar with the area.

Foley said that Hauptmann drew the road maps at the request of Attorney General David T. Wilentz, of New Jersey, but the Bronx prosecutor would not say what induced Hauptmann to participate in an activity so revealing to the prosecution.

Drew From Memory
When Hauptmann was here to be questioned, Foley said, "he was not forthcoming."

DISPUTE TROUBLES LABOR CONVENTION

Storm Brews in the Building

San Francisco, Oct. 4.—(AP)—The storm brewing in the building trades department came to a head today, casting a shadow over the American Federation of Labor convention.

The executive council of the A. F. of M. decided to take up the controversy today in a last minute effort to keep it from the floor of the House of Representatives.

Leaders of both factions said they saw little likelihood of a compromise.

The dispute involved the refusal of the building trades department to accept the recommendation of its own executive council to seat delegates from the ca. penters, electricians and electrical workers international unions.

While the delegates watched anxiously the developments in this internal dispute, the words of President William Green were still fresh in their minds that workers of the world must unite in the interests of international peace.

Asserting it is the "purpose and will of the workers of the world to see that war never occurs again," Green said labor must move solidly to prevent war, and that the federation president cannot allow those with a mad lust for power to have their way.

AUSTRIAN OFFICIAL ARRESTED AS SPY

Accused of Informing German Nazis When Raids Were to Be Made.

Vienna, Oct. 4.—(AP)—Dr. Franz Sontheimer, chief of the Secret Code Bureau of the Austrian government, has been arrested on charges of informing German Nazis in advance of all security measures planned by the Austrian government.

The government's disclosure that Sontheimer had been jailed for espionage created a sensation throughout Austria because he is a direct descendant of the famous poet, Franz Grillparzer, and was highly trusted by the government.

Sontheimer kept up an extensive code correspondence with German spies, and was in fact, for a time, the head of the Department of Commerce which were kept under secret surveillance.
