



# ITALIAN VICE CONSUL FLAYS DEMONSTRATION HITS THE MARKET

Charge That Two Women Were New Haven, Oct. 9.-(AP) - An nti-Fascist demonstration which narked the visit to Yale of students epresenting 26 Italian Universities.

anti-Fascist demonstration which marked the visit to Yale of students representing 26 Italian Universities, brought a sharp criticism today from Pasquale de Cicco, Italian vice consul in New Haven.

To the charge made by the New Haven branch of the American League against War and Fascism that two women "were beaten by these representatives of Italian 'culture'" during the class Saturday, the vice consul replied:

"I say that the whole thing is absolutely false. No women were touched in that unfortunate clash. The provocators used the characteristically professional cowardly method of having women in their band. But I wish to emphasize the fact that no women were harmed in any way.

"The fact that these boys had the fortune or misfortune to be burn in Italy is no reason that they should be insulted. It is because of a few irresponsible people that many international misunderstandings are caused."

The disturbance occurred when an unidentified man shouted "Down with Mussolini" as the students arrived at Yale to attend the Eli-Columbia football game as guests of the University.
