## ASSASSINATE YUGOSLAV KING

### SEVEN-RUN OUTBURST IN 3RD GIVES CARDS BIG EDGE ON TIGERS

Red Birds Stage One of Greatest Rallies in Series History, Drive Three Bengal Hurlers to Showers, Anker, Hogsett, Rowe, Dizzy Dean Gives 3 Hits.

Navin Field, Detroit, Oct. 9.—Joe Medwick's run in with Owen in the sixth inning of the final World Series clash between the St. Louis Cardinals and the Detroit Tigers precipitated a demonstration by the huge crowd of fans and forced delay of the game indefinitely late this afternoon. All sorts of fruit and vegetables were thrown on the field and much time was spent in clearing the diamond.

After a seven-run outburst in the third which gave the Red Birds a 7 to 0 margin in the crucial contest, the Cardinals came back to score two more runs in the six when Martin singled and went to second on an error, Medwick tripled scoring Martin, and Collins lifted his fourth single of the day to score Medwick.

Dizzy Dean was in trouble only once up to the sixth, being reached for a single and a double, by Greenberg and Fox, respectively, but he pulled himself together and retired the side without a loss. The Tigers had only got three hits off his delivery through the fifth frame.

Navin Field, Oct. 9.—(AP)—The Cardinals staged one of the greatest rallies in World Series history today to score seven runs in the fifth inning for Jerome Herman (Dizzy) Dean and pile up a 7 to 0 lead over the battered Tigers in the seventh and deciding game of the series.

While the great Dean set the Tigers down without a hit in the first three innings, only one man reaching base safely in that time on Collins' error, the Cards slaughtered these pitchers. Elden Auker, Lyawood (Schoolboy) Rowe and Elton Hogsett, before being checked by Tommy Bridges.

Thirteen men faced them, seven hit safely, three doubled, there were three bases on balls, the socks were all right, three fragments were hit, got two hits, a single and double, world series record for a pitcher in one inning.

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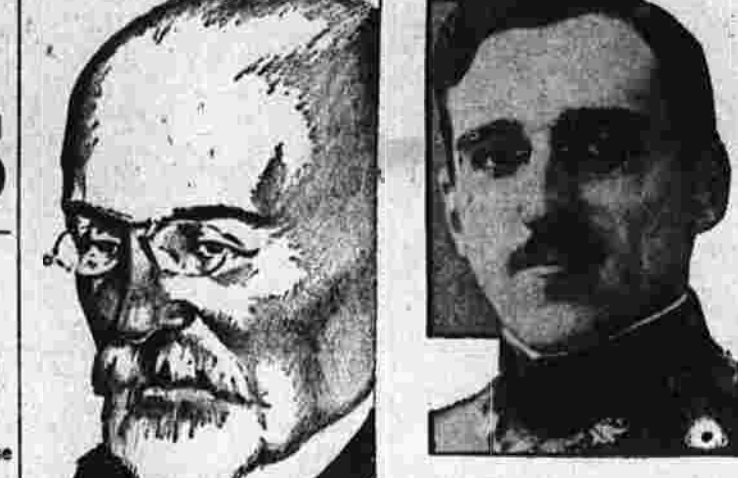
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### Victims of Assassins' Bullets

### LINDBERGH IDENTIFIES VOICE OF HAUPTMANN

Tells Jury It Was Voice of Man Heard When Ransom Was Passed—Indictment Voted.

Trenton, N. J., Oct. 9.—(AP)—The voice that shouted "Hey Doctor" over a Bronx cemetery fence the night Col. Charles A. Lindbergh paid \$200,000 in a futile attempt to ransom his infant son, has been identified by the juror as that of Bruno Richard Hauptmann.

The story of how Col. Lindbergh kept the memory of the voice from the Haymond's cemetery was disclosed by Col. H. Norman Schwarzschild, superintendent of the New Jersey State police, a few hours after a Hunterdon county Grand Jury indicted Hauptmann on a charge of murder in the kidnap case.

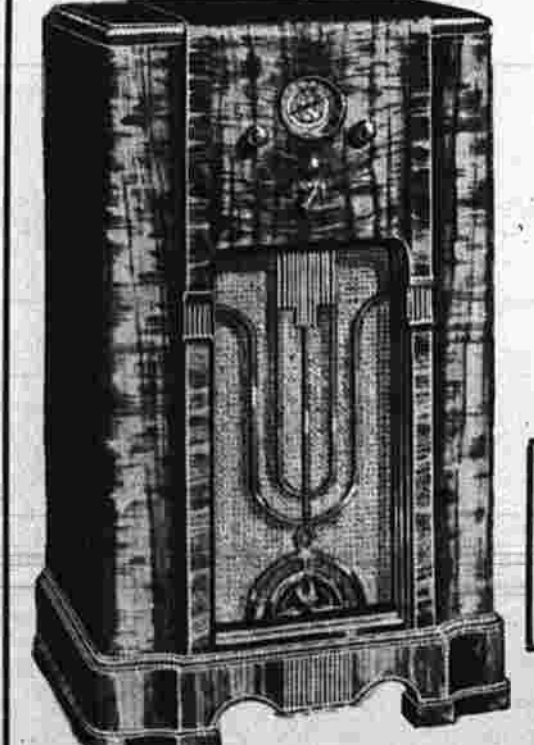
