"Will the Governor tell us why he has had the sudden change of heart? What changes did he recommend to the last legislature? What changes does he recommend now?

"He had full opportunity to suggest changes in the law between the date of its passage and the date of adjournment of the legislature of 1933. He has had the power to call a special session since.

"As governor I will do what the present chief executive has not done, I will give every ounce of my ability and experience to support a fair, equitable, and workable law.

"Let's eliminate explanations regarding why we were inflicted with the present law. Let's confine ourselves to the record on that point. But above all, let's follow the Republican platform and correct the situation as we find it."
