TYPHOON IN MANILA CAUSES MUCH LOSS

At Least Five Are Dead—Thousands Made Homeless—Damage May Reach Several Millions.

Manila, P. I., Oct. 15.—(AP)—At least five persons lost their lives and thousands were left homeless by a sudden tropical typhoon which twisted Manila from a well-ordered city into a confusion of debris in the early morning hours today.

Five drownings in one section of the city were the first fatalities reported in the violent storm. "It seems a miracle that there are any survivors left in view of the falling roofs, trees and poles," said Governor General Frank Murphy after a survey of the havoc-stricken city.

Manila was a scene of desolation as convicts, police and city workers joined to clear debris from streets. Streets and parks were flooded. Thousands of trees were uprooted by the 57 miles an hour wind.

Unlike the lesser typhoons which preceded it in recent weeks, the tropical storm struck without warning. Ships had no time to leave their anchorages behind the breakwater and seek safety in broad Manila Bay.

While the heaviest property damage probably was in Manila, weather bureau officials said loss of life was most likely in nearby provinces. The typhoon's northward path was only fifty miles from this Philippine metropolis.

A correspondent of the Manila Tribune, estimated ten thousand natives were left homeless in Bulacan province, north of Manila. He reported 2,000 small, thatched houses were blown down and many persons were injured. He had no reports of fatalities.

To Rush Relief. After a survey of damages here, Governor General Frank Murphy announced Secretary of Finance Alfonso De La Liza, would release \$500,000 for relief in the city and other affected districts.
