Stir until sugar is dissolved. Pour into a mold and pack in equal parts of ice and sait. Let stand three or four hours before serving.

Sift flour once, measure, add sait and baking powder and sift together three times. Separate yolks from whites of eggs and bet yolks until thick and lemon colored. Cream shortening and gradually beat in sugar. Add yolks of eggs and beat well. Add flour, alternately with milk, a small amount at a time, beating after each addition until smooth.
