

Hauptmann Nearer Trial for Murder

His Plea Against Extradition to New Jersey Rejected—His Counsel Files a New Appeal.

New York, Oct. 17.—(AP)—Bruno Richard Hauptmann, a step closer today to trial for the murder of the infant son of Col. Charles A. Lindbergh. His plea against extradition rejected, Hauptmann's only hope of preventing his removal to New Jersey now lies in an appeal to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court. His counsel, James A. Fawcett, plans to file an appeal immediately.

The unending carpenter's fight against extradition was dealt a compromise and null for damages brought by Attorney John F. Foley of 25 Emerson street for damages for injuries alleged to have been suffered by the plaintiff from a fall on Center street at Victoria House.

Foley in his complaint brought in Superior Court, sought damages of \$1,500, but a conference between the attorneys and the court resulted in compromise claim of \$500.

Stay of Execution

After the decision was announced Fawcett obtained a stay of execution until four p. m. Friday in order to bring his appeal before the Appellate Division. It is considered likely that action on the appeal will be taken by that time.

Hauptmann remains in the Bronx county jail, where he has been held since his arrest nearly a month ago. If the final barrier to his extradition is removed, he will be taken immediately to Flemington, N. J., where his trial will take place. New Jersey authorities were ready to transfer Hauptmann across the Hudson last night if Justice Hammer had not granted the stay.

Dennis Writing Notes

The decision blasting Hauptmann's hope of evading trial on the murder charge came at a night session following Hauptmann's appearance on the stand in the Lindbergh case which he denied, calmly and deliberately, that he had written the ransom notes furnished by Col. Lindbergh after the baby was kidnaped.

The stolid German stonewall was called by the stand by his counsel and given the ransom money. Fawcett, telling him to examine the notes carefully, asked Hauptmann whether they were in his handwriting. Hauptmann read each note. Not a word of his handwriting nine minutes he scrutinized the collection. "It is not my handwriting. It is the first time I ever saw it."

Mayor Frank Hayes of Waterbury, Democratic nominee for lieutenant governor, in following the form asserted the Republicans had offered the state a relief measure, Roosevelt's relief measure. He cited this as a reason why voters of the state should support the Democratic ticket.

Washington, Oct. 17.—(AP)—The story of an all-day quest to free Mrs. Alice Speed Stoll from the hands of an insane and brutal kidnaper was told today by Department of Justice officials.

Louisville, Ky., Oct. 17.—(AP)—Thampered no longer by any danger to Mrs. Alice Speed Stoll, Federal agents today concentrated their efforts on running down Thomas H. Robinson, Jr., named as the mad kidnaper who took the society woman from her home here last Wednesday for \$50,000 ransom.

In Louisville, decision as to whether Robinson would face life imprisonment or of death hinged on a consultation to be held between U. S. District Judge Thomas J. Sparks, and Commonwealth's Attorney Emmet O'Neal. Kentucky provides death in the electric chair as the maximum punishment for kidnaping. The Federal government, under the Lindbergh law, can go 30 further than life imprisonment.

"We can give him death," O'Neal said, "but we are not taking any steps towards prosecution unless we have the full approval of Mr. Sparks."

At Sparks' office it was said there would be no conflict between state and Federal prosecutors over the case.

In Bowling Today

Mrs. Stoll, daughter of one of Kentucky's wealthiest families, was given complete isolation today in order that she might rest. She lay in her bed in her lounge on Elm Street. Joyous relatives stayed away from the 15-room estate but received reports that she was recovering from the shock of her experience. She was judged to be a "gentleman."

Robinson was believed to be somewhere in the mid-west, and it was hoped some clue might be obtained from the apartment house in Indianapolis where Mrs. Stoll spent six harrowing days. Mrs. Robinson was reported in police circles to have been taken there by Federal agents to point out the apartment. The latter declined to say whether she was still here or in Indianapolis. Corbett.

CHIEF DESCRIBES WORK OF POLICE

Gordon Says Protection of Life and Property Are Two Main Objectives.

The protection of property and life are two objectives of a police department and it is in view of the fact that Chief Samuel Gordon, of the local police staff, spoke before a group of young people yesterday in order to carry out such a program as protection of life and property.

Chief Gordon, in paying tribute to each of whom has been under 30 years of age, they must be at least 5 feet 8 inches tall, and weigh more than 140 pounds, before getting the job. In addition, each was selected from a mass of applicants by a board of commissioners, was schooled for ten weeks, and then placed on probation for six weeks before he was able to assume his duties as a member of the police force.

From then on, it is his job to act as a guardian over the district involved in his assigned beat. Among other things he must be on duty on the alert for fire and theft, and at certain times he must attend to school children as they cross the main thoroughfares.

One of the most important aids in criminal detection is fingerprints. Every person arrested on a serious offense is fingerprinted. Three copies are made for the fingerprint bureau, one for the Washington bureau, and another for the local police. There is an average of 2,000 prints, no two alike, being made per day and through the efficiency of the bureau many crimes have been solved. At these centers a single print bureau is developed where the trade mark of 8,000 of the most dangerous individuals are singled out along with their photographs.
