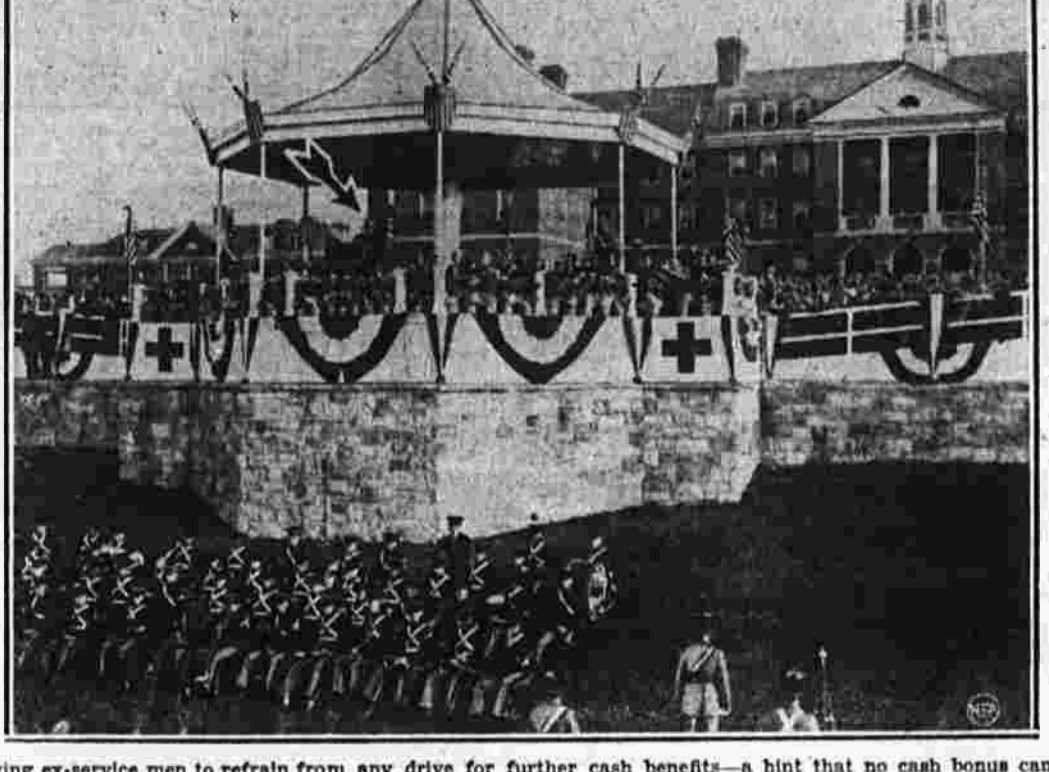

Prizes Totalling \$200 Are Offered Pupils in Schools of the State.

Thirty cash prizes, totalling more than \$200, are being offered to the pupils of Connecticut schools competing in the historical essay contest sponsored by the state Tercentenary Commission. These prizes have been contributed by the Connecticut Society of the Colonial Dames of America.

First prize winners in each of three groups into which the contestants have been divided, in accordance with their school grades, will also receive from the Commission honorific medals which are being issued as official mementoes of the contest.

The first prize will be \$50 for the best essay submitted by pupils in the eighth and ninth grades. Second prize will be \$25 for the best essay submitted by pupils in the tenth and eleventh grades. Third prize will be \$25 for the best essay submitted by pupils in the twelfth grade.

The contest is open to all pupils in the eighth, ninth, tenth, and eleventh grades of the public schools of the state. Essays should be sent to the Tercentenary Commission, 100 State Street, Hartford, Conn., by October 31, 1934.
