

Coach 100 Years Old.

King George IV reigned between the years of 1820 and 1830, in England. It was necessary, therefore, to procure a vehicle for him which by its authenticity would maintain the dignity and effectiveness of the royal atmosphere.

Such a coach was found, after several months of stable-hunting and barn-investigating. As a matter of fact, the King's carriage had been used by a family of English settlers during the time when George IV was King of England. Of course, the old vehicle had to be refinished. It is interesting to note, however, that the under-carriage—or, as we would say in reference to automobiles, the "chassis"—was in excellent condition.


