

FINANCIAL REPORTS SHOULD BE SIMPLER

Accountants Report to Bankers That Federal Laws Tend to Bewilder the Average Investor.

White Sulphur Springs, W. Va., Oct. 31.—(AP)—Draught simplification of corporate reporting requirements under the Federal securities legislation, not only to relieve the burden upon corporations but actually to protect the investor, has been urged upon the Securities and Exchange Commission by an advisory group of accountants formed at the request of the commission. These recommendations were sought by the commission in its program to clear away all possible red tape in its administration of Federal securities laws and it still is understood to have the accountants' report under consideration. This program of the commission has been widely praised by bankers attending the Investment Bankers Association convention, which ends here today as it relieves to prove an important factor in reviving corporate financing.

Number of Visitors

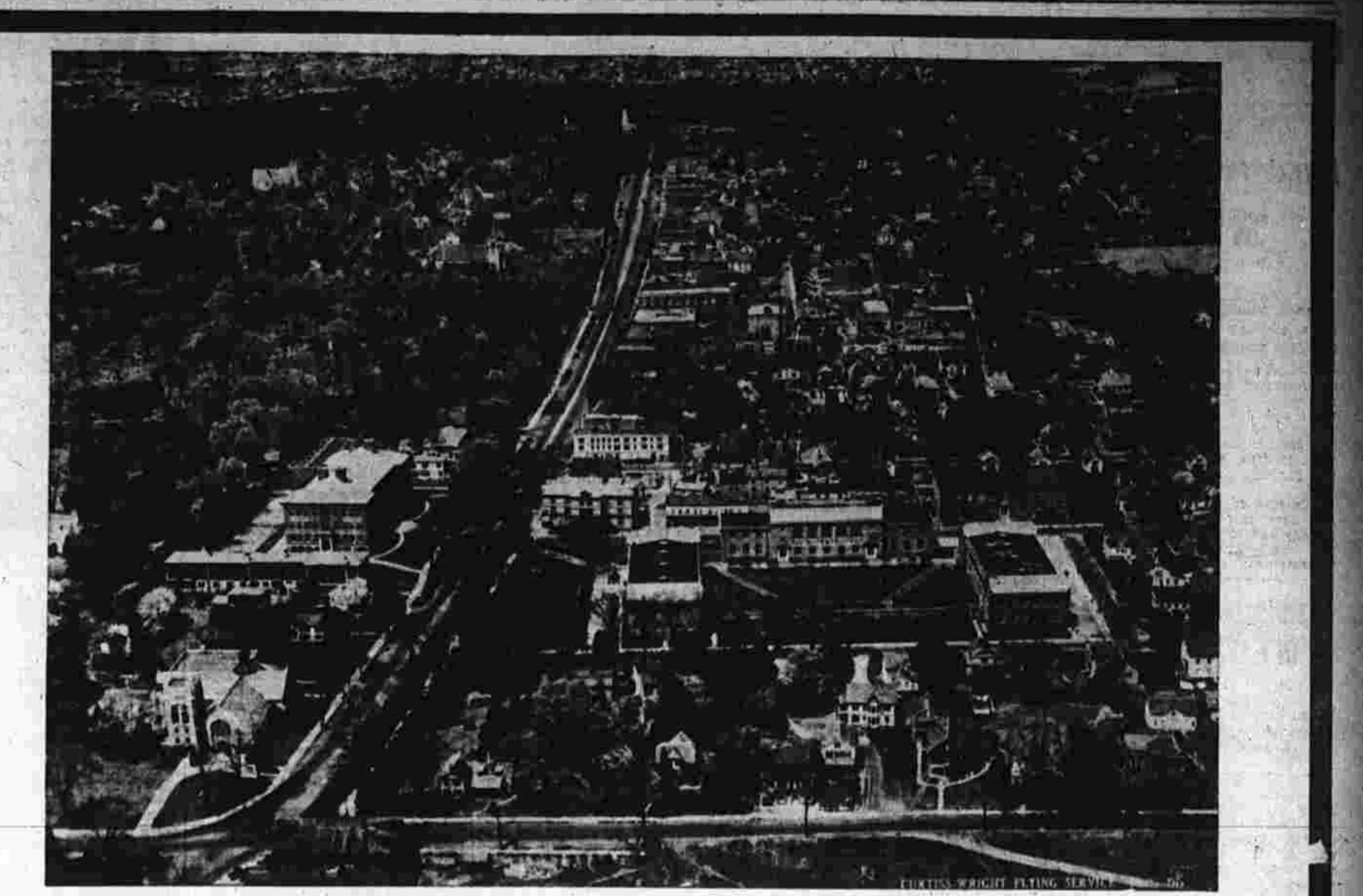

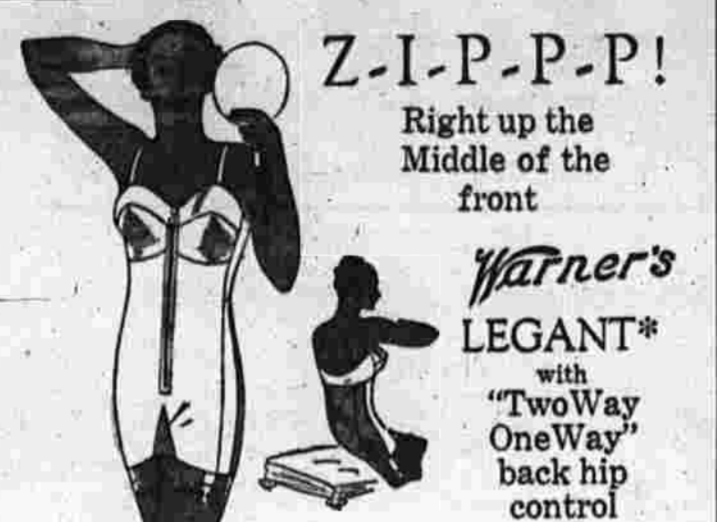

WARD'S BUTTONS IN NEW DESIGNS

Overall and Playsuit Fasteners Stamped With Company Monogram.

Ward customers who have purchased Ward overalls and playsuits in the past have probably paid slight attention to buttons. But the newly designed metal monogrammed buttons are bound to attract attention because of their construction. The overall type is of course oxidized against rusting but it is the flat top finish with raised rim and raised W monogram that holds the eye. Similarly the playsuit buttons are constructed of a new metal with a japanned type black background. The new design is a "W" monogram.

Today there are approximately 70,000 gross of buttons manufactured in this country annually worth about \$20,000,000. These figures compare favorably with values for the total production of cutlery and edged tools; almost equals that of blocks and equals watches.

In England at the commencement of the 17th Century the button made the buttons of the world. Metal buttons first appeared in the Ward's Bureau of Design have created a new era in button making. The variety known as gilt buttons are a mixture of copper and zinc with brass and copper. Mon brass is unalloyed for gilding. The gilt process is accomplished through an amalgam of quicksilver and gold.

Newly designed buttons are cut from a large sheet of special metal and the shanks affixed by solder.

ALEXANDER'S DEATH HAS SOVIET ANGLE

Youthful Romance in Carlist Court Seen as Causing Trip to France.

By MELVIN E. COLEMAN (Associated Press Staff Writer)

A youthful romance at the court of the czar of Russia was in the background of the political picture which took Alexander of Yugoslavia to France on the visit of state which gave opportunity for assassins to mow down him and Louis Barthou, French foreign minister.

Opposed Franco-Soviet Move
A ruler in fact as well as in name, he had put his government on record as opposed to the new Franco-Soviet rapprochement. Yugoslavian delegates worked against admission of the Soviet Union to the League of Nations. The Belgrade government refused to follow the example of Rumania and Czechoslovakia, its allies in the Little Entente, in extending recognition to the Soviet Union.

This course, coupled with Alexander's recent overtures to Bulgaria, led to Paris to prearrange a possible weakening of the bonds between the republic and the Little Entente. It aroused French anxiety similar to that which arose earlier in the year when Poland entered a non-aggression pact with Adolf Hitler's third Reich.

Italo-French Accord Affected
And recent indications of a resurgence of anti-Italian feeling in Alexander's domain also threatened the foundations of an Italian-French understanding which Barthou hoped to conclude soon with Benito Mussolini at Rome.

Alexander's distrust of the Paris government had its genesis in both personal and family feeling. When he was a boy he was sent to St. Petersburg, then seat of the brilliant Russian court, to serve as a page and to absorb Slavic royal traditions.

It was he, in fact, who appealed to the czar for help for following "Bismarck" when Austria's ultimatum in 1914 set the world aflame with war. He had an advocate at court in Grand Duchess Tatiana, daughter of the czar. They had become closely attached while the then Serbian prince had been serving as a page.

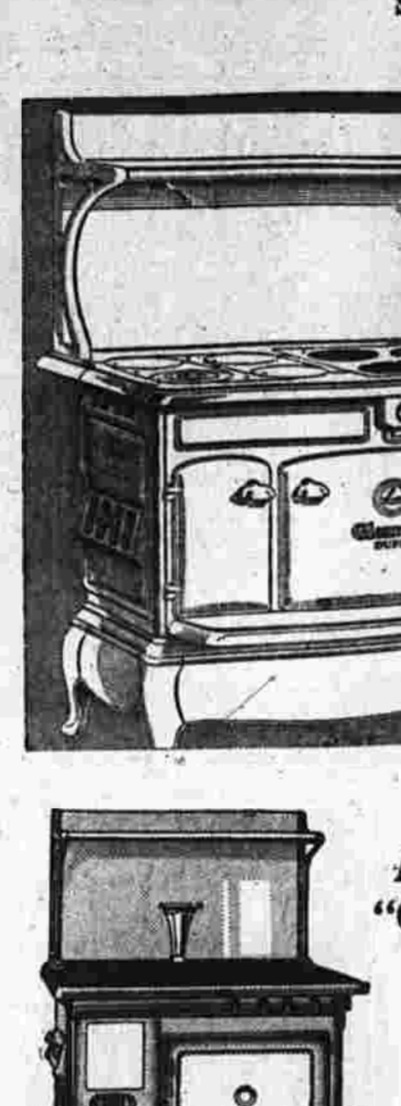
Ended in Eisenberg
The romance ended in the cellar at Eisenberg, Siberia, where Bolsheviks killed Tatiana and all her family in 1918.

Three years later Alexander married Princess Marie of Rumania, but always his intentions has been a haven for refugees from Russia. And always his government has suppressed sternly any evidence of communism in Yugoslavia.

Also at Belgrade there has been Alexander's widowed sister, Princess Helena. Her husband, Prince Prince Ivan Constantimovich, son of Grand Duke Constantine of Imperial Russia. Prince Ivan also died in that tragic year of 1918.
