

HEAVY VOTE HERE DESPITE THE RAIN

Maintain Average of 600 an Hour—Do Not Expect Over 7,300 Total; Both Major Parties Have Large Organizations at Work Trying to Get Out Record Vote.

The vote polled in Manchester at 8 o'clock this afternoon totaled 6,837. The total at 11 a. m. was 7,039; at noon 7,502 at 1 p. m. 4,310 and at 2 p. m. 4,800.

Massing their full strength behind well selected and trained organizations both major parties here today brought out one of the largest voter lists in the town's history despite one of the most discouraging days in many years from the standpoint of weather.

At present time today the count on the 14 voting machines was an even 4,000, keeping the average for the day at exactly 600 an hour. At 5 o'clock the large Democratic groups were rapidly catching up with the long list of those having voted and a concerted drive to get every vote possible in line before the polls close at 6 o'clock was being made.

At 6:30 this morning twenty men of advanced years definitely proved the intense interest that is being shown in the state election despite the inclement weather during the forenoon.

A score of cars were being utilized by the Republican town committee with drivers selected from the Young Republican group doing duty continuously all morning.

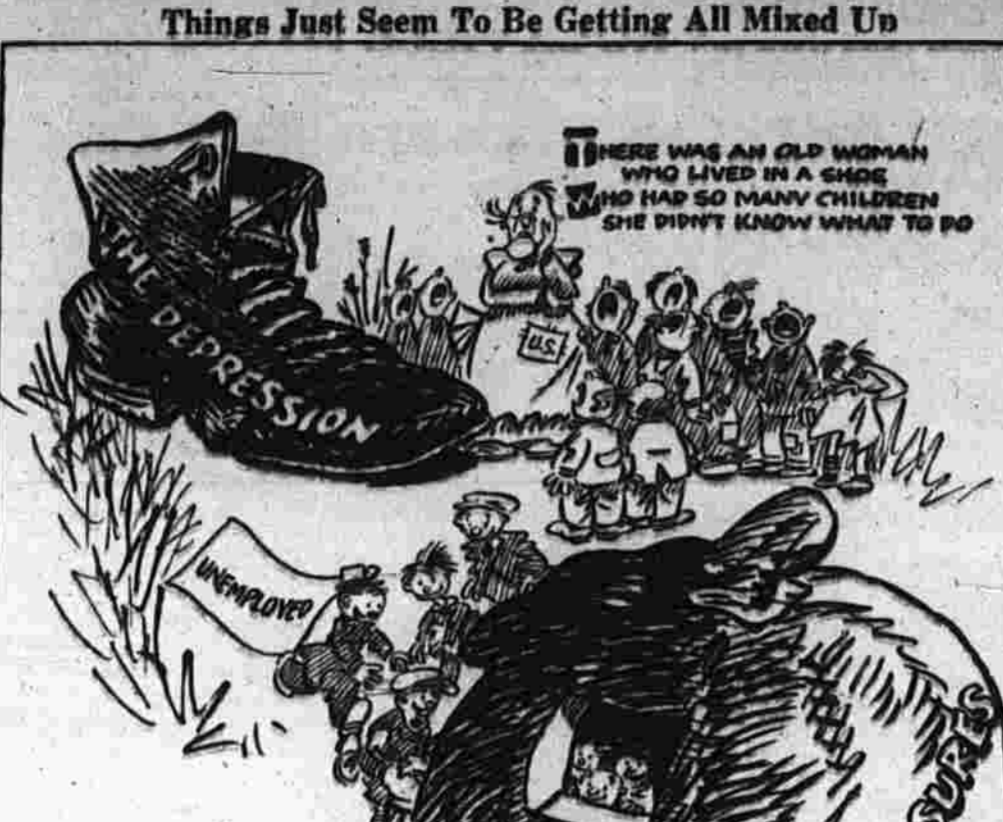

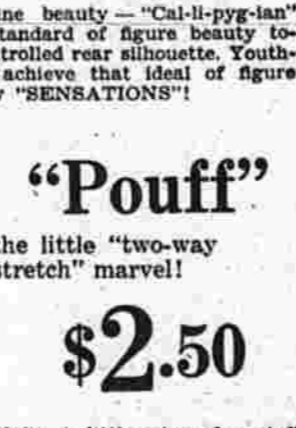
