NATION DEMOCRATIC BY BIG MAJORITIES; REED IS DEFEATED

For First Time Since Civil War Pennsylvania Deserts Republican Party; Democrats Elect 24 U. S. Senators to Gain Two-Thirds Majority; Name 241 to House Seats.

By ASSOCIATED PRESS. Returns from yesterday's National elections, in which the Democrats generally triumphed overwhelmingly, showed that Joseph F. Guffey, Pittsburgh oil man, had been sent to the Senate by Pennsylvania, and George H. Earle, former minister to Austria, had been selected as governor.

Throughout the nation, the Democrats elected 24 Senators, winning nine Senate seats from Republicans, to give them a two-thirds majority for the first time since pre-Civil War days, with four contests still undecided.

They also had named 241 Democrats to House seats compared with 77 Republicans with many contests pending. The G. O. P. captured 13 Democratic seats while the Democrats took 15 Republican seats.

Leaders in Senate Fights. Democrats were leading in all four undecided Senate fights, two races in New Mexico against the Democrats and Wyoming.

This was the first time Pennsylvania had elected a Democratic senator since Civil War times and a Democratic governor in a general election.

The state also elected 11 Democratic representatives and nine Republicans, with 14 remaining in doubt. Twenty-one states had elected Democratic governors compared with six which named Republicans.
