Washington, Nov. 8 .- (AP) - Mr. Roosevelt motored to the White Cheered by the election results, House and plunged into work with-out comment on the overwhelming New Deal victory in the Tuesday President Roosevelt today took up the vital problems of unemployment relief and government expenditures upon his return to the White House from a voting trip to his home in Hyde Park, New York.

The trouble started when a busload of workers arrived at the Standard plant to report. 


