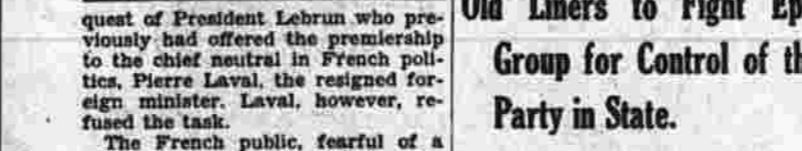


DOUMERGUE RESIGNS AS FRENCH PREMIER

Flandin Agrees to Form New Government; Paris Fears a Repetition of the Previous Riots.

Paris, Nov. 8.—(AP)—Shouting thousands of persons smashed through police lines in front of the opera tonight, as many in the throng cried: "Down with the deputies!" Authorities, who feared disorders would ensue after the resignation today of Premier Gaston Doumergue and his cabinet, had driven up the police in troops and demonstrators were arrested.

Paris, Nov. 8.—(AP)—French politics tossed Premier Gaston Doumergue into the discard today and Doumergue's minister of public works, Etienne Flandin, agreed to form a new French government and serve as premier. He accepted this task at the reply.



Gaston Doumergue, president of the French public, fearful of a repetition of the riots which brought the Doumergue government into being, watched the rapid succession of events with nervousness.

Services for the others will be held in churches of their own denominations.

In House Democrats Have 317 Seats and Republicans 102—In Senate Democrats 69, Republican 25—38 Democratic Governors to 8 Republicans.

Washington, Nov. 8.—(AP)—President Roosevelt, returning today to exercise tremendous new power in carrying out the New Deal, saw his party victory grow more emphatic in Congress as late returns showed.

Late counts for Congress gave the Democrats eight more seats in the House and the astonishing lineup read as follows: Democrats 317; Republicans 102; Progressives 7; Farmer-Labor 3; in doubt 6.

Late returns showed this roster of government: Democrats 69; Republicans 25; Progressives 1; Farmer-Labor 1.

This Senate lineup was based on the assumption that Democrats and Republicans would split two seats in New Mexico as latest returns indicated they would.

Late returns showed this roster of government: Democrats 38; Republicans 8; Progressives 1; Farmer-Labor 1.

The Republicans drew some consolation from the defeat of Maryland Democratic governor, Albert C. Ritchie by Harry W. Nice after a close race.

Some predict that Congress divided into a huge majority and a pitiful minority, would proceed to split on lines more economic than political, putting pressure on the White House from right and left in a more marked degree than in the past.

The Republican campaign command, whipped and deluged, it would not stay whipped, sought to reform the lines for 1936. A. B. Blakeslee had not been given out.

Of the 33 Senate seats held Tuesday, the Democrats, on the all but complete count, had taken 25, Republicans 7 and Progressives and Farmer-Laborists one apiece.

There was some shifting in government. Democrats lost one to Wisconsin Progressive and three to Republicans in Michigan, Maryland and New Jersey.

The four governorships about which there still was a bit of doubt went to Whiting, where Democrat Leslie A. Miller was ahead and Nevada, where Richard Kirsan, Democrat, was leading.

In New Mexico, the Independent Republican Senator, Bronson Cutting, held a slight lead for the long term over Representative Dennis Chavez, ardent Roosevelt follower, while Governor Carl A. Hatch, Democrat, apparently was elected over former Governor R. C. Dillon for the short term.
