### PREDICTS LOWER CHICKEN PRICES

Frederick Miller of North Coventry Says 30 Cents a Pound Will Be Average.

Frederick Miller of North Coventry, one of the largest producers of eggs and poultry in this section of the state, is not expecting any big advance in the wholesale price of chickens, this afternoon, to indicate that the price of last year would be passed.

Broilers, which will average about two and a half pounds, he does not expect will go over 22 cents a pound—live weight, which will mean that the price for larger chickens weighing five pounds or more will bring about 30 cents.

The chief reason for the present price is due to a great extent to the strike of Jewish butchers in New York, which is the largest chicken market in the United States and where prices are quoted as low as a year ago because of the extra cost of shipping the birds to the market.

Mr. Miller does not raise poultry for the meat value, but gives most of his efforts to raising broilers. He has built up a trade in Hartford and makes trips twice each week to that city, where he sells his broilers to large markets and stores. He does not dispose of them in the auction market. At present he has about 3,000 chickens and fowl at his ranch.

He is starting to reduce his stock, as during the hard winter season he does not raise more than 2,000 birds, having ample stock for the number. He is killing off the additional stock of the market, reducing the number about 100 a week. His chicken ranch consists of about 80 acres. He grows his own corn and considered one of the leading poultry men in the state.

There was a time when scientists believed that acquired characteristics could be transmitted. Now this view has been largely abandoned because of the lack of any experimental evidence to support it.

It was thought at one time that leprosy was hereditary; now we know it to be infectious. Another early belief was that syphilis was hereditary; it is now known that it is the organism of syphilis that is transmitted and that the disease itself is not hereditary.
