

### HOW CHARITY OFFICE HERE WAS FILLED

#### Federal Relief Official Tells Why Mrs. George T. Wilson Was Named Investigator for This Town.

The real story behind the appointment of Mrs. George T. Wilson as charity investigator for the town of Manchester was obtained from Miss Helen Hart, attached to the Federal Relief office in Hartford, by the Evening Herald today following the storm of protest that arose last night with the publication of Mrs. Wilson's appointment.

How Named  
Miss Hart said Federal Relief officials had approved of Mrs. Wilson's appointment upon the recommendation of Mrs. Margaret Miller, district Federal Relief supervisor. Mrs. Miller was said by Miss Hart to have been given the authority to seek a trained charity investigator by local towns engaged in the relief work.

It was stated that no person was found among the unemployed in Manchester who possessed the training in social service work necessary to measure up to the Federal qualifications required of persons engaged in charity investigation duties.

None Qualified  
Miss Hart said that there might be several in the local unemployed ranks who were sufficiently well educated to serve as aides to the charity investigator, but lacked the necessary social service training to act as the investigating authority. Housing Administrator James A. Moffett assailed the plan.

"Private capital would immediately freeze up again," he said, "and real estate values throughout the country would be knocked down overnight to twenty cents on the dollar of present values."

### U. S. Will Continue Aid for Unemployed

Chicago, Nov. 24.—(AP)—The nation's needy were assured today of further aid from their government.

The assurance came from Federal Administrator Harry H. Hopkins, who told the mayors of 85 of the country's chief cities that as long as there was need of relief the people would get it.

He replied to charges of waste with a declaration that the cost of his relief administration averaged seven and a half per cent as against 30 to 40 per cent for private organizations.

Hopkins said the work method was the way to meet the problem and that he was convinced that "with the men we now have in the White House and the Congress that will be met in January the things will be met more satisfactorily for the American people."

Pietro H. LaGuardia, mayor of New York city, told the municipal executive meeting, that non-political elections and non-partisan administrations were powerful factors in removing city governments of extravagance and inefficiency.

### U. S. NOW SEEKS NEW ACCORD ON NAVAL POLICIES

#### If Present Parley Fails She Will Ask Britain to Join Her to Prevent Building Race.

London, Nov. 24.—(AP)—In the event the present naval limitations treaty is junked, the United States probably will seek an informal accord with Great Britain on a general naval policy in order to prevent a naval building race between the two powers, it was learned authoritatively today.

Such an informal accord probably would include undertakings to keep each other fully advised of the other's building program as well as an agreement to make both fleets complementary.

It was stated, however, that the United States would not have been taken place, and it was expected that the United States would be evident there was no further hope of reaching a compromise on a naval treaty.
