

FIND BODY OF MAN STUFFED IN BARREL

Police Believe Murder Was Committed in Columbus, O., and Body Taken to Cincinnati.

Columbus, O., Nov. 25.—(AP)—Evidence indicating that a man whose nude body was found crammed in a barrel in Cincinnati was Alvin Brunner, a jewelry auctioneer of Brooklyn, N. Y., and that he was slain in the rear of a Columbus jewelry store, was uncovered by detectives today.

Disclosing new clues to the crime, Detective Chief Eugene Ehrhart, said:

"We found that a gun was missing from the store, and a blood spot in the rear of the store and we determined that a barrel was missing from a bakery nearby. It probably was the barrel in which the man's body was found at Cincinnati."

"We are satisfied at naturally not identifying here the killing took place here. We are reasonably sure of the identification of the body as that of Brunner."

GUARDSMEN FIND HARTFORD YACHT

Located Off Norfolk, Va., With Few Sails Left—On Way to Florida.

New York, Nov. 25.—(AP)—Two disabled yachts, missing on the Atlantic with 15 persons aboard, were found early today.

The schooner White Cloud, its steering gear disabled by a scientific and treasure-hunting expedition to the Spanish main, was located 300 miles northeast of Puerto Rico by the U. S. S. Rangitata. The schooner, which was chartered by the Coast Guard cutter Mascoutin, 35 miles off the Virginia coast. Eleven men are on the White Cloud.

NEW HAVEN CHURCH WRECKED BY BLAZE

Loss Is Estimated at \$25,000—Valuable Paintings Are Destroyed by Fire.

New Haven, Nov. 25.—(AP)—A fire which burst unchecked for two hours early today wrecked the vestry room and damaged the sanctuary of St. John's Roman Catholic church at Davenport avenue and South street with a loss estimated at \$25,000.

The blaze was discovered by employees of New Haven hospital who saw smoke issuing from the building. They notified priests at the rectory who summoned firemen.

Flames leaped through two open doors of the vestry into the sanctuary, charring the roof, main altar and destroying several valuable paintings and altar decorations.
