SEE SOLUTION NEAR IN SISTERS' DEATHS

Police Say There Is Connection Between Couple Found Dead and "Babes in Woods."

Carlisle, Pa., Nov. 28.—(AP)—State police working on the four-day-old mystery of five bodies found in the Pennsylvania mountains made their way through a maze of clues today and found "the whole setup looks good."

It was the first definite expression of confidence from the police whose superintendent, Major Lynn G. Adams said yesterday "until we identify the children and establish the cause of death we are helpless."

A connection between the three mystery girls found dead in a lonely, nearly wooded and the man and woman shot to death in Dunmore, Pa., 100 miles away, has been an objective since. Lady Ashley is the former Sylvia Hawks musical comedy actress.

Today Harry L. McElroy, chief of state police detectives, said "the mass of clues and details is steadily linking the Dunmore and Carlisle crimes into one."

Dunes of clues McElroy has sifted dozens of leads and though many were discarded after long and wearisome tracing, he announced "we have a chain of circumstances that you can't jump over."

Trails have led to New England, California, and south to Baltimore. On the strength of leads from lodging places within a radius of 100 miles of Carlisle, the police are concentrating major attention within Pennsylvania boundaries.

The trail appears to run from South Langhorne, east of Philadelphia, west to Dunmore.

BRITAIN FEARS ATTACK BY GERMANY FROM AIR

Winston Churchill Tells Commons That Reich Has Force Now Almost Equal to British.

London, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Winston Churchill, Conservative party leader, declared in the House of Commons today that Germany already has a military air force rapidly approaching equality with that of Great Britain and that the present defense forces of Great Britain are entirely inadequate.

His statement was made as he opened the important debate on defense in Parliament and he urged the British to put themselves in a position of security.

Churchill said that the great new fact riveting the attention of every country in Europe was that "Germany is re-arming."

TWO FEDERAL MEN DIE IN FIGHT WITH NELSON

Killer of Dillinger Was Nelson's Victim

Chicago, Nov. 28.—(AP)—An un-identified man who remained in the Bureau of Investigation against the pleadings of his young wife who married him for his safety, but he had been close by when W. Carter Baum, his friend and fellow agent, was slain by Nelson near the Little Bohemia resort in Wisconsin last April and he pleaded himself to the service until Nelson was dead.

A native of Des Moines, Ia., Holts entered Drake University and after a year's training in the Bureau of Investigation he was sent to Oklahoma City. Later he was transferred to the Detroit bureau, and still later was transferred to Chicago.

He was married on Thanksgiving Day, 1927, to Miss Genevieve Glenn of Council Bluffs, Ia. Besides his wife he is survived by a four-year-old son. Relatives said his body would be taken to Des Moines for burial.

He did not elaborate, and additional information whether Holts was the man who shot Dillinger could not be obtained.

When Dillinger was slain, the Department of Justice announced the name of his killer would never be made public.

Holts remained in the Bureau of Investigation against the pleadings of his young wife who married him for his safety, but he had been close by when W. Carter Baum, his friend and fellow agent, was slain by Nelson near the Little Bohemia resort in Wisconsin last April and he pleaded himself to the service until Nelson was dead.

Baby Face Bandit Mows Down Trio of Government's Ace Man Hunters

Believe That John Hamilton Was With Him When He Escaped.

Chicago, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Samuel P. Cowley, one of the Federal government's ace man hunters, died early today from bullet wounds inflicted in a gun battle with George (Baby Face) Nelson in which another Federal man was killed. He died in an eight hospital as the government threw all its power into a hunt for Nelson, one of the few remaining members of John Dillinger's gang. Nelson was named as one of the men who shot down Cowley and Hamilton.

Two men who shot down Cowley and Hamilton were in a burst of gunfire in suburban Barrington, late yesterday afternoon. Holts' death instantly as the show-off of bullets that Nelson and an unidentified companion unloaded in a brief but furious gun battle.

Even as he lay dying, it was disclosed by Department of Justice agents that Cowley was the real leader in the Federal drive that brought down the notorious Dillinger, although Melvin H. Cowley also commanded the government manhunters in tracking down Charles (Pretty Boy) Floyd in an Ohio cornfield. Department of Justice agents disclosed.

Thus Nelson, the nation's public enemy No. 1, took deadly vengeance for the slaying of Dillinger, but in so doing he signed his own death warrant for Federal agents carried on a relentless search for him with orders to shoot first.

In addition to all the power the Department of Justice could concentrate in this area, half of the 200 detectives of the Chicago police force were called into the hunt for the baby face killer.

FRENCH PEASANTS CLASH WITH COPS

Leaders Say 50,000 Will Stage Demonstration in Streets of Paris.

Paris, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Hundreds of discontented peasants, seeking to march through the streets of Paris in contravention of a government ban on demonstrations, clashed with heavy police forces today but were dispersed with some of their number injured.

The peasants, members of the "Peasant Front," a group of militant farmers organizations, marched to the capital to protest against agricultural conditions. Front leaders had claimed that 50,000 would march on the capital from their farms.

Other manifestations of discontent were feared from taxi-cab drivers in protest against a new regulation limiting their working day to 12 hours.

The clashes today were preceded by a demonstration of malcontented soldiers who squatted in the boulevards last night, blocking traffic in protest at the government's failure to repeal drastic cuts in their pay.
