AUSTRALIA FLIERS LOST OVER PACIFIC

Gasoline Gives Out and Ulim and Companions are Forced to Land on Ocean; Navy to the Rescue.

Honolulu, Dec. 4.—(AP)—"Will land in the sea," said a brief message at 12:30 a. m. today, Hawaii time (2 p. m. e. s. t.) from the Hawaii-bound plane of Lieutenant Charles T. P. Ulim and two companions, as they sailed the Army and Navy to stand by.

At 8:35 a. m., after a battle of nearly two hours to find his way successfully to Wheeler Field, Army airport near here, Ulim gave up and sent out an SOS. At the same message he said he was south of Honolulu but was heading back toward his plotted course.

Honolulu, Dec. 4.—(AP)—Off his course and virtually out of gasoline on a flight from Oakland to Honolulu, Flight Lieutenant Charles T. P. Ulim today sent out a general emergency call as a Coast Guard cutter and three Navy planes dashed to his aid.

His plane, "Star of Australia," carrying himself, Co-Pilot George M. Littlejohn and Navigator-Radio Operator J. L. Skilling, became overdue on its scheduled arrival here shortly after 7 a. m. today.

Can Fleet Few Days Before leaving Oakland, Calif., airport at 12 p. m., (Pacific time) yesterday, Ulim said they were forced to alight on the ocean enroute their plane would float several days, if necessary. Not being equipped with pontoons, they would not be able to take off again.

The Coast Guard cutter Itasca left her moorings as soon as possible after the plane plighted because of the weather, according to reports. The cutter was carrying a full load of gasoline when it was called to duty.

San Francisco, Dec. 4.—(AP)—The Ulim plane bound for Honolulu and running short of gasoline, wireless here at 10 a. m. today. The information came through the Globe wireless station at Honolulu.

In messages picked up here Lieutenant Charles T. P. Ulim, pilot of the plane, was begging for "beacons," presumably radio beacons, that he might be guided safely to his Honolulu destination.

HOLDING AMERICAN FOR CARRYING GUN

French Police at First Believed Woman Shot Man—Revolver Unloaded.

Paris, Dec. 4.—(AP)—Miss Margery Chadwick of St. Louis, Mo., was booked on two minor charges today after police established that a man she was supposed to have shot was not shot by Miss Chadwick at all since Miss Chadwick's revolver was not loaded.

They also established that the man who was shot was merely an innocent bystander and that he had been shot by a policeman.

He who got shot was Maurice Giegars, player in a cabaret orchestra conducted by Andre Ecklyar. Mr. Ecklyar appeared greatly upset over the whole affair and charged Miss Chadwick with having hit her in the head with the revolver which everybody found out later wasn't loaded.

It all happened at about 2 a. m. as Miss Chadwick was leaving the cabaret, called "The Bull On the Ramp," in the Champs Elysees district, as bedtime broke loose.

Woman's Story As Miss Chadwick explained it, she had dropped some jewels earlier in the evening and she went out on the sidewalk in front of the cabaret in wait for Ecklyar, who merely wanted to frighten him, she said.

COLT CO. KNEW THAT WAR WAS COMING IN 1908

Spent Money to Organize a Sales Force in Europe Six Years Before War Began, Probers Hear.

Washington, Dec. 4.—(AP)—Evidence that arms manufacturers were probably destroyed by an earthquake in an official message today from the Colt Patent Firearms Company with the government in a tax case indicated that the company's anticipation of the war, the committee said.

Think Hundreds Killed By Quake in Honduras

Tegucigalpa, Honduras, Dec. 4.—(AP)—Three towns with a total population of 6,500 persons were reported as probably destroyed by an earthquake in Octopecque department in an official message today from Tegucigalpa, the new capital of Honduras. The three towns named were San Jorge, population 2,000; La Encarnacion, 3,000, and San Mateo, 1,500.

Owing to the wreckage of communications systems, no details regarding the fate of the inhabitants or the exact time of the quake but it was regarded as probable that there was no serious damage. No reports had come through today from the eastern region of the country, although communication lines were known to have been strayed, there were no indications of damage there.
