

# 'WAR THREAT' ENDED BY LEAGUE'S ACTION

### Compromise Reached in Dispute—Hungary Asked to Take Punitive Action Against Terrorists.

Geneva, Dec. 11.—(AP)—A threatening Yugoslav-Hungarian quarrel was ended today and the agreement hailed by Geneva statesmen as a notable triumph for the League of Nations.

Especially gratifying to them was that it followed closely the removal under League auspices of another European "war threat." This was the Saar basin territory plebiscite and a solution reached on the difficult problem of policing the territory during the vote.

Both Hungary and Yugoslavia at last night approved a resolution "empowering the administration of King Alexander of Yugoslavia at Marsettes.

### Punitive Action

Hungary was asked in a tactful way to take punitive action against any authorities whose capabilities have been established as to "communicate to the Council the measures which it takes to this effect."

Statements of major European powers were vastly relieved when the government of Budapest, after studying a draft of the agreement, instructed its representative to "vote for the resolution."

Belief was expressed in the resolution that certain Hungarian authorities may have assumed, at any rate through negligence, certain responsibilities relative to acts having connection with the perpetration of the crime at Marsettes.

### Results of Survey

This conclusion was based on a study of "the diplomatic correspondence exchange between Yugoslavia and Hungarian governments from 1931 to 1934."

Under the resolution the Council set up a committee of experts to draw up a draft of an "international convention to assure repression of conspiracies or crimes committed with political and terrorist purposes."

The agreement was introduced by Captain Anthony Eden, British Lord Privy Seal, who received a five-minute French co-operation.

It was learned that several petitions have been received by the League of Nations for the past two years from Croat communities abroad demanding a "autonomous status as a nation for the Croats in Yugoslavia."

Many of the petitions came from Croats in Youngtown, Ohio, Chicago, Pittsburgh, Cleveland and also groups in Canada and South America. Similar petitions were known to have been delivered to the heads of various governments.

Some of the documents threatened open rebellion against Yugoslavia.

### Political Pressure

Flemington, N. J., Dec. 11.—(AP)—Bruno Hauptmann, the hold-up man, stood handcuffed in Hunterdon county court today for fifteen minutes as he listened to preliminary arguments in his attorneys' demand on the state for a bill of particulars on the indictment that he murdered Charles A. Lindbergh, Jr.

The arguments were short-lived, for Supreme Court Justice Thomas W. Trenchard, who presided, postponed hearing in the matter until Thursday when the defense requested that he sit a date when Edward Kelly, chief defense counsel, could be present.

Justice Trenchard assured the defense that Hauptmann would be in court when the motion was argued. "There will be no action affecting the defendant except in his presence," he ruled.

### Hearing Date Set

After the hearing date was set but before Hauptmann was led back to jail, the justice, here for the first time, ordered the state to open to the public the special panel of 150 prospective jurors who sat in the courtroom.
