His Claim That He Senate Position Entitles Him to Immunity, Is Rejected.

Washington, Dec. 20.—(AP)—The District of Columbia Supreme Court today ruled that Huey P. Young, Jr., who claims that he is entitled to immunity from prosecution because of his position as a member of the Senate, must stand trial for the murder of Senator John C. Hunter.

Young, who was charged with the murder of Senator Hunter, had argued that his position as a member of the Senate entitled him to immunity from prosecution. However, the court ruled that this immunity does not apply to criminal offenses.

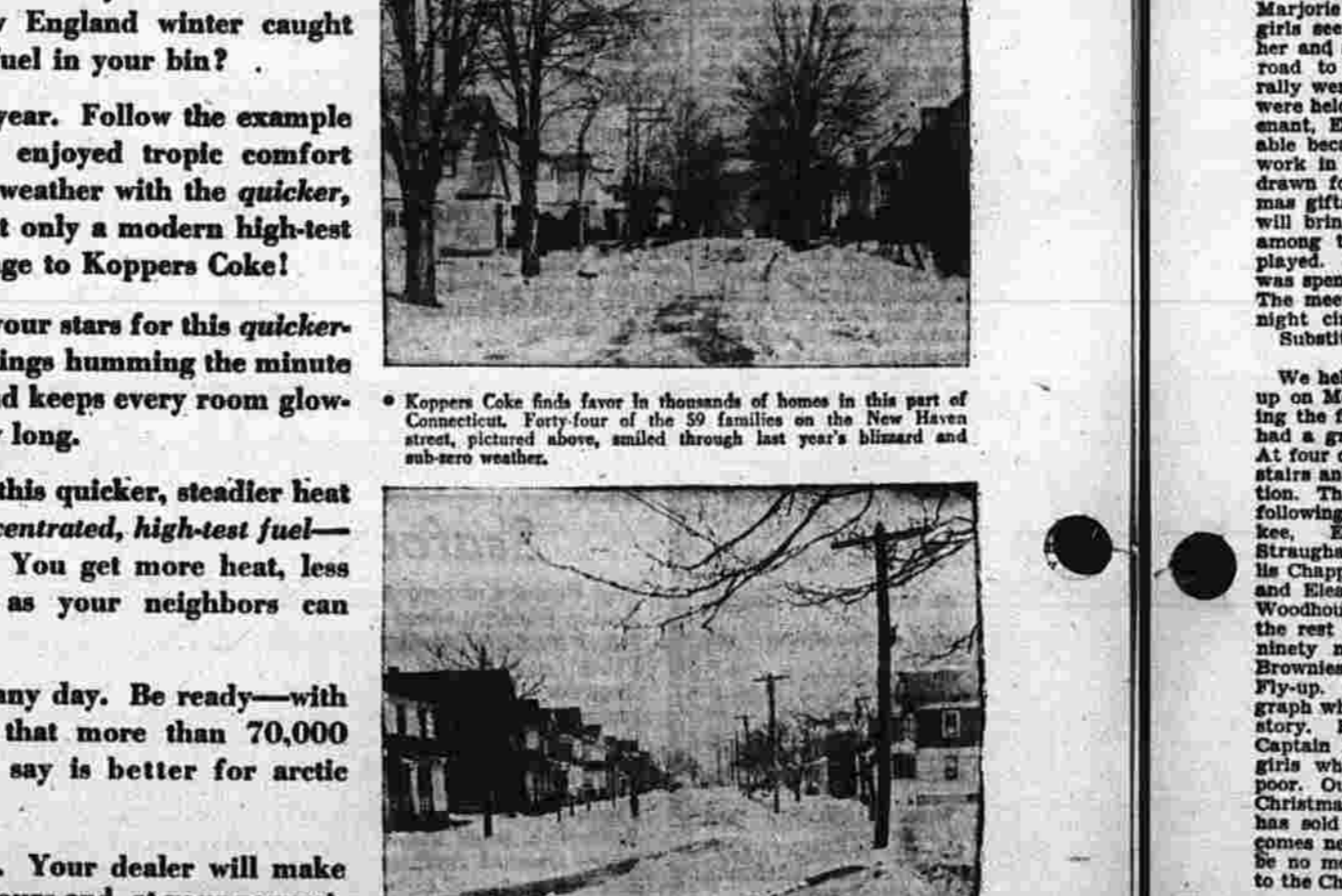
