REV. DR. BEARD DIES IN HIS 101ST YEAR

Was Oldest Yale Graduate and Oldest Congregational Minister in the United States. Embellishment Charge — To Be Tried Again.

Norwalk, Dec. 22.—(AP)—Rev. Augustus F. Beard, D.D., oldest graduate of Yale University, and oldest Congregational minister in the United States, who celebrated his 101st birthday on May 11, died this morning at his home here.

At the age of 96 years, Edward was re-elected president of the South Norwalk savings bank for the fourth year last July. He is believed to be the oldest living savings bank president in the country.

Dr. Beard, a native of Norwalk, took his first airplane ride at 100 and said it was "wonderful." As part of the observance of his 100th birthday, he preached in the First Congregational church here.

Dr. Beard, a staunch Republican, always maintained a keen interest in public affairs. In a letter written on the occasion of his 101st birthday anniversary, he said: "I am an old and old-fashioned and way off from the 'New Deal' and its new-fangled theories. I am up-to-date in education, or President and his remarkable qualities but I do not think him infallible."
