THOMS WILL LEAD HOUSE DEMOCRATS

Outlines Plan for Equal Representation on Legislative Committees — Expects Bitter Assembly Fight.

Hartford, Dec. 28.—(AP)—Under the leadership of Representative John N. Thoms of Waterbury, Democrats reached today for a bill which has studded them since 18—equal representation on legislative committees.

Thoms set the goal last night after he was nominated for the House speakership at a committee meeting of Representatives-elect. If he gains his objective he will be following in the footsteps of his father, William E. Thoms who as Democratic House leader in 1875 fought successfully for equal committee representation.

Expect Bitter Fight Political observers predicted that the fight for equal representation in the 1935 General Assembly would be much sterner than that in 1931. Republicans control the House by an overwhelming majority. The Speaker will go to a member of their party. Thoms automatically will become minority floor leader.

Represents Third Term Thoms who begins his third term in the House next month, defeated Representative-elect Stanley Youshever of Danbury, 50 to 48 in the speakership nomination. The latter will be the youngest member in the House.

Representatives Philip Pastore of Haven and Robert M. Dowling of Meriden were named a committee by Thoms to confer with Republicans concerning more committee assignments for Democrats.

RETURN TO GOLD STANDARD, PLEA OF ECONOMIST

Chicago, Dec. 28.—(AP)—The Nation was advised today by a group of its leading economists to return immediately to the gold standard.

Warning against "what they described as the shoals of inflation, a course nearer center in its industrial policies was advised by the economists, gathered for the annual meeting of the American Economic Association, in a report made public last night.

Want Statement An immediate statement by the government whether it intends to return to the gold standard was demanded by the economists as important to recovery, while government gold withdrawal was urged as essential to the maintenance of a government-owned and operated Central bank.

WOULD TAKE P. O. OUT OF POLITICS Senator Vandenberg Has Bill Ready to Present at the Coming Congress.

Washington, Dec. 28.—(AP)—A proposal to take the post office department out of politics by establishing it on a permanent career service basis was announced today by Senator Vandenberg, Republican, Michigan.

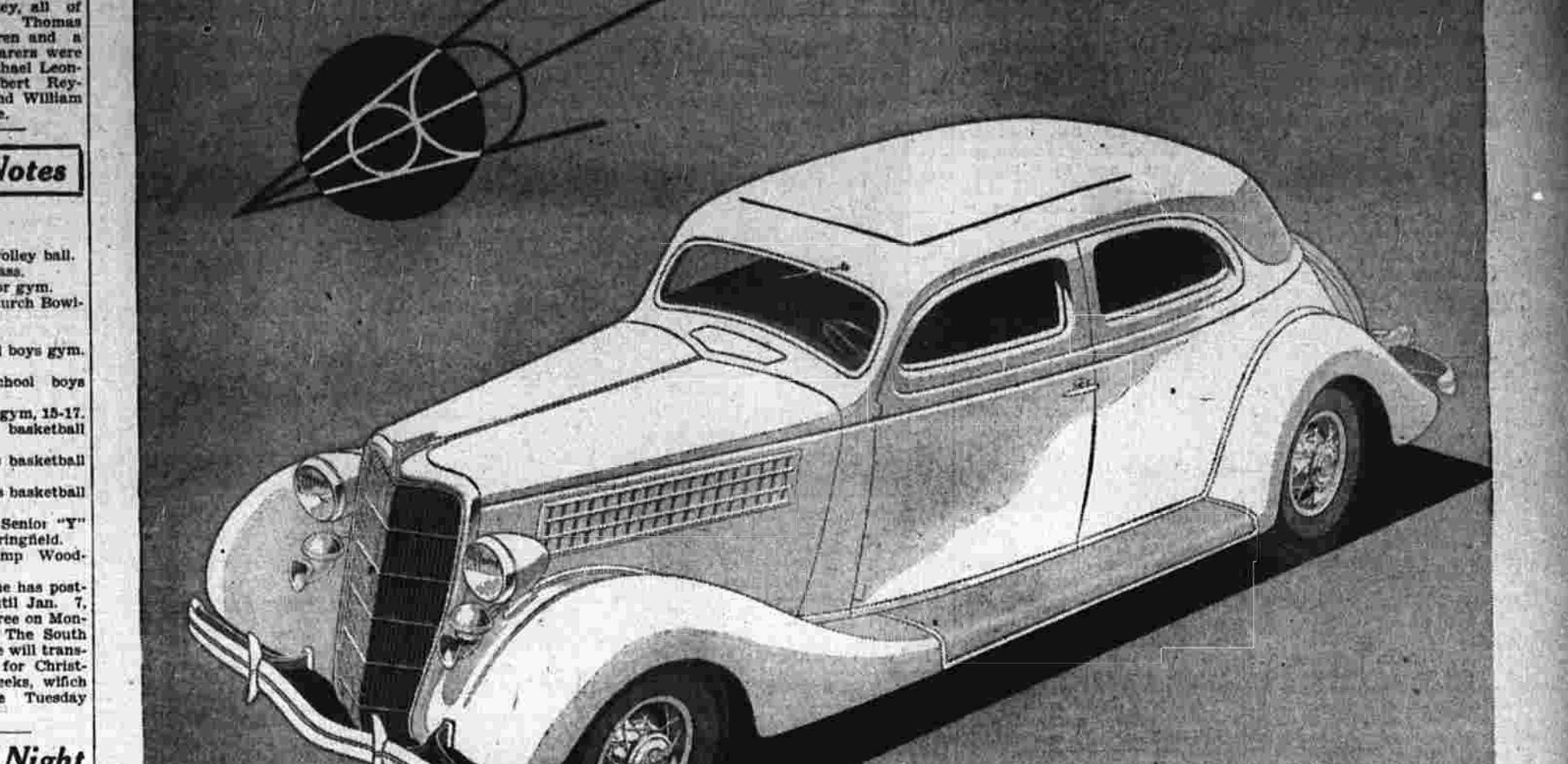

Counterfeit \$5 and \$10 bills found in the deposits of regular customers yesterday today prompted the Manchester Trust company to ask The Herald to warn the public to be on the watch for others of the same kind. Treasurer Harold Alvord said that it should be easy to discover the counterfeiters, as the bills are very poor imitations of the real thing. The bills received at the bank were a \$5 and a \$10. The former was easily distinguishable from the genuine, while the latter required but little more inspection to prove its worthlessness. The printing on the \$10 bill was much lighter and the design were blurred to the extent of being no designs at all. Both bills were quite old.
While these two bills are the only ones discovered so far, it is considered possible that many more have been foisted on the public locally and bank officials expressed the hope that all persons would be careful in transactions involving bills of any denomination.

TOWN STORE PLAN STILL UNDECIDED

Many Ramifications Necessitate Careful Study Say Selectmen.

CANNED MILK TO BE ALLOTTED TO NEEDY

Conservation Hears That Wisconsin Product Is to Be Distributed Here.

Manchester residents on the charity list probably will receive an allotment of powdered and canned milk to be shipped into this state from Wisconsin by the government, Town Treasurer George H. Waldoff learned yesterday at a conference of milk producers and FEPA social service workers in New Haven. Just when this canned milk will arrive is not known, Mr. Waldoff said.
During November charity reports with children were given 3,000 quarts of fresh milk and 3,200 cans of evaporated and condensed milk. Local milk dealers furnished the fresh milk and the stores here the condensed milk.
The groups meeting in New Haven sought to determine the extent of the potential fresh milk available to Connecticut dealers and producers, if they are willing to supply their product at a price the welfare agencies can afford to meet.
A program under which both the producers and the dealers would accept less money for charity milk was discussed but further action will await further conference.
Whether the program of the state dealers and producers will strike a snag when the government begins shipping in canned milk remains to be seen. Incidentally, it was brought out that only 60 per cent of the milk produced in Connecticut is fluid milk. The rest goes into the making of butter, cheese, ice cream and other dairy products.
