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## FAMINE FACING FLOOD VICTIMS IN MISSISSIPPI

Disease Also Lurks in Wake of Overflow Waters—At Least 25 Reported Dead in Area.

MARKS, Miss., Jan. 25.—(AP)—With at least 25 persons reported dead and approximately 25,000 marooned, by flood waters in North-west Mississippi today, the situation is grim.

Marked the first of the flood victims as the overflow waters from the region of the Cold Water river spread steadily into the town which has a population of 1,200.

Volunteers and convicts put up a three days battle to save the levee last night after the water plunged through.

The damage has already been estimated at more than \$1,000,000. The levee is expected to be a loss of \$1,000,000.

Fear is expressed by the mayor of the overflow in Quitman, Polk county, which has a population of 1,200.

Schools, churches, the railroad station and box cars were pressed into service to house the refugees from the flood.

There was intense suffering in Tate, Tunica, Polk and Quitman counties as shivering refugees crowded into the little "cotton counties" towns by the hundreds and sought any available sort of shelter.

Water through a wide section rose to the tops of houses and trees. Rescue boats had to send convoys around to break channels through the surface frozen waters.

Relief camps were established at all high points. Dozens of persons were brought in with their hands and feet frozen, some were unconscious. Women gave birth to children on house-tops. Some brought in from trees and house-tops drowned.

Food became scarce. Mrs. Roark, Marks Red Cross worker said she received reports five negroes drowned in one house near Sledge and three negroes had also drowned.

Two negroes, she said, were reported drowned while trying to save miles near Darling.
