Washington. Feb. 16— Critics of the administration's five billion-dollar work-relief bill are considering a proposal that will strike terror into the hearts of many New Dealers.

The idea is to bring administrations and cabinet members to the Senate floor, where they can be questioned in detail as to administration measures—somewhat after the manner of the British Parliament.

A simple change in Senate rules would permit the invitation of high officials to the chamber for questioning. And it would be difficult for an invited official to refuse with dignity.

The chief reason for hesitation in proposing such a rule has been the certainty that administration forces would combine to bury the resolution in committee. But
