Audience Told at Start That State Control and Local Option Will Remain in the Act.

State Capitol, Hartford, Feb. 20.—(AP)—Retention of the principle of state control and local option became a virtual certainty today as the judiciary committee of the General Assembly was described by its chairman as committed to these two propositions in the Liquor Control Act.

The first official expression on the committee's attitude on liquor was given by Senator J. Kenneth Bradley, Republican, in opening the House hearing on the subject. Hundreds jammed every available inch of the spacious hall of the House to listen to arguments for and against liberalization of the certain provisions of the state liquor act.

"The committee feels," Chairman Bradley said in opening the hearing, "that it is definitely committed to some form of state control."

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STOCK TRADING BY MELLON IS TOLD BY CLERK

Asserts That His Chief Sold "Short" While Secretary and Lost by Transactions.

Pittsburgh, Feb. 20.—(AP)—Andrew W. Mellon's confidential secretary, Howard M. Johnson, told the Board of Tax Appeals today that his chief sold two blocks of "short" in 1931 while he was Mellon's secretary.

Johnson told the stand as a witness at the board's hearing on Mellon's petition for a refund of \$139,000 for overpaid taxes in 1931. The government charged Mellon with fraud and claims he owes more than \$2,000,000.

The witness said on direct examination that the two blocks Mellon sold consisted of 2,500 shares of Westinghouse.

One was sold "short," he testified, in March, and the other in April of 1931. Mellon took a profit of \$72,000 on the transaction, Johnson related, but lost \$483,000 on the deal which he "covered by delivering to him 2,500 shares of his own portfolio."

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19 Is Dangerous Age For Youths of Nation

Washington, Feb. 20.—(AP)—A study of arrests during the last year indicated today that 19 is a dangerous age for young men and 23 for women.

Findings were based on 243,062 arrest cards sent to the Federal Bureau of Investigation by the Department of Justice during 1934. The cards came from 7,220 police departments, police officers and law enforcement agencies.

Nineteen-year-old youths were arrested for 17,394 crimes, including 219 homicides, 2,086 robberies, 792 assaults, 2,411 burglaries, 2,640 cases of larceny, 1,145 auto thefts and 229 law violations involving weapons.

The majority of crimes reported—55.7 per cent—were credited to persons under 30 years. Youths under 20 were charged with 35.4 per cent.





MADRID MAN WANTS THE SPANISH CROWN

New Pretender to Mythical Andorran Throne Claims Right to Rule.

Madrid—(AP)—Andorra, tiny republic in the Pyrenees, continues to interest throne-hunters. Scarcely had the self-styled "Baron I. Baron of Skoszyr" been deposed from Spain as an undesirable after his efforts to seat himself as king of the 3,300 mountaineers, when another pretender made his appearance. Fernando de los Cuadros Salcedo, marquis of Castellón, 40-year-old poet and attorney, practicing in Madrid, announced that if someone was to become king of Andorra he could establish as good a claim to the throne as anybody.

Clams Royal Descent He exhibited a genealogical chart purporting to prove he is the direct descendant of Alfonso III, king of Aragon and original Count of Urgell.

As such, the marquis argues, he inherits the title of Count of Urgell and should supersede in authority the present king of France and the Spanish bishop of Urgell, who now are recognized as joint masters of Andorra.

The marquis opened headquarters here and invited signatures to his petition for recognition as the new king.

Baron Pathway Rough The dagger Boris was scouted to the Portuguese frontier after being convicted under the recently enacted law against vagabonds. He promptly was arrested by Portuguese authorities who found fault with his papers, and was jailed in Lisbon.

This did not prevent him from issuing a detailed manifesto asserting his intention to continue setting for the Andorran throne.

The new candidate is of Basque blood and has been credited by admirers with having, by his several volumes of verse, "inaugurated a new Basque culture."

And like Boris, the new pretender's main cause of chagrin thus far has been in failing to find someone who will take his claims seriously. Like Boris, he believes France to be much better off under a monarch asserting "an undue influence" on the Andorrans and that they would be shocked estimated equal to 400 volts can be delivered by the electric eel.
