

Many doctors do not discover adhesions because they examine the patient while lying down. It is usually necessary to examine the patient in a standing position in order to locate the real cause of the trouble.

There are a few cases where adhesions are so bad that they can only be separated by cutting them loose with the scalpel. However, it is possible to loosen most adhesions by deep manipulations. The bloodless surgeon can separate the organs which have joined together without opening up the abdominal walls. The deep stretching and pulling treatments must sometimes be continued for several months before the required results are obtained. Frequent examinations should be made with the aid of the fluoroscope to see what changes are taking place. Once the adhered tissues have become separated, they can then be restored to their proper positions through the use of systematic exercises.




