LOCAL WOMAN HAS INVERTED STOMACH

Suffering from Same Trouble as Alice McHenry—Age and Operation.

Although nation-wide publicity has been given the case of Alice McHenry, who underwent a 24-hour operation last week to have her inverted stomach and other misplaced organs put in their normal position, there is living in Manchester today a woman whose internal organs are "upside down" as were those of Alice before the operation.

Owing to the age of this woman it was not felt advisable to perform an operation. She will go through with her abdominal viscera up under the left lung.

In cases of congenital diaphragmatic hernia, with which the Manchester woman is and Alice McHenry was afflicted, the diaphragm separates the chest from the abdominal cavity. The hernia is a hole in the diaphragm which causes the abdominal viscera to be pushed up under the left lung.

Because of the presence of these organs in their unusual positions in the chest, the left lung becomes compressed and the heart is pushed to the left toward the right side.

The Manchester Medical Society has studied this case and decided the age of the woman precluded an operation.

About three years ago a local veterinarian did a Werström operation on the woman, but the hernia was regulated hernia caused by displacement of her internal organs.

So it will appear that Alice's condition is not a rarity and that similar cases frequently are brought to the attention of the medical fraternity.

HILLIARD'S STRIKE NEARLY YEAR OLD

Over 100 Workers Left Mill Last March 26—Still Being Investigated.

The strike of textile workers of the E. H. Hilliard plant in Hilliardville, despite several attempts to arrive at a satisfactory settlement, will be one year old on March 26. On that date one year ago over 100 workers walked out and picketed the mill property after demanding a 25 per cent increase in wages, and the attempt on the part of the Connecticut Department of Labor, Official of the Regional Labor Relations Board in Boston and officials of the local U. I. W. of the Hilliard plant, failed of a settlement.

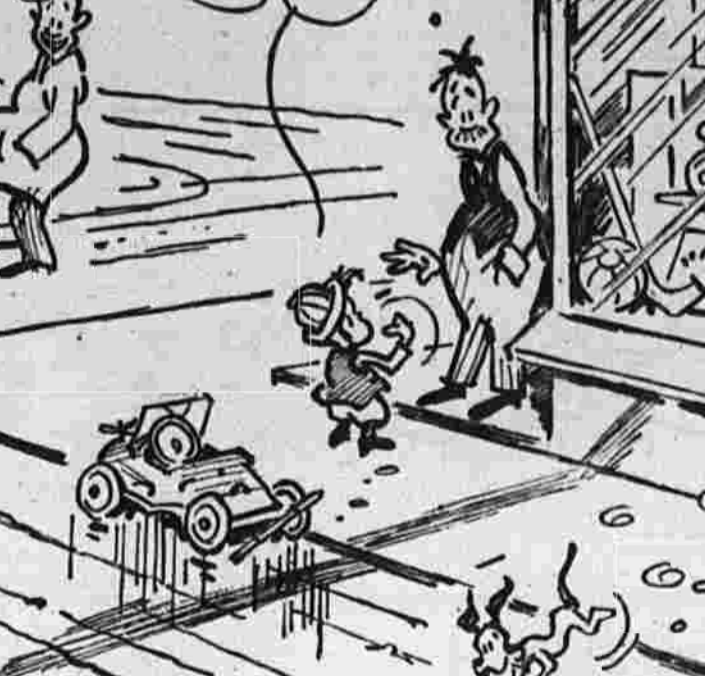

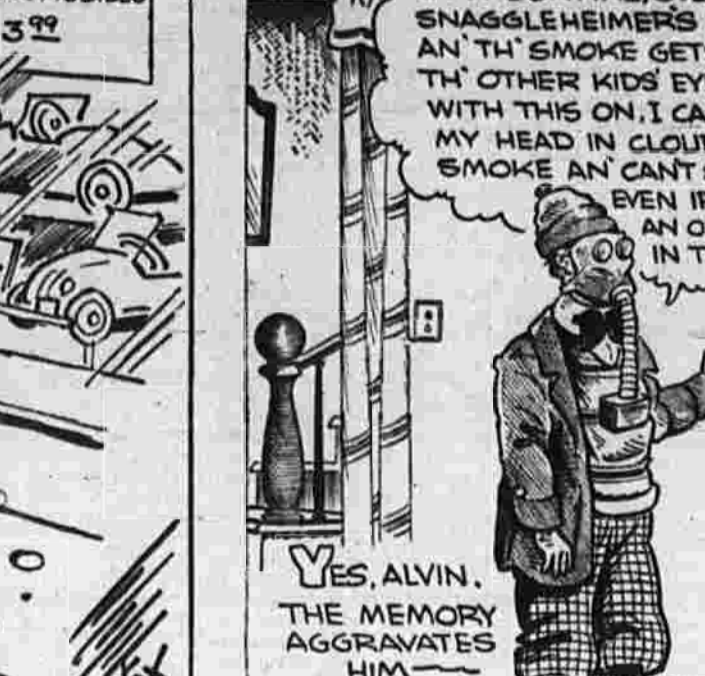

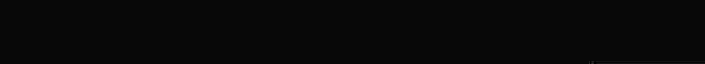
